

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Language of Heaven A burning rubbish tip in Jerusalem (Gehenna) provided Jesus with one image of Hell. Here is John Henry Newman's image. Have you travelled to a foreign country and can't speak the language? There is lots of weeping and gnashing of teeth. What if you were born with a good ear for languages, but had deliberately never learnt the language of that other place? You would only have yourself to blame. It would be a living hell. That is what happens at death. The soul is suddenly transported to a different dimension of existence, and it can be either heavenly or hellish depending on the choices and actions of a lifetime. So, our lifetime project is to 'learn the language of heaven'. We can mainly do this by following the story of Jesus, the Word of God, the perfect conversation between humanity and God. We could pause for a moment to move from incommunicado to communion by

How often after an event are we much more the wiser?? How we wish, like Solomon, that we had asked for **Wisdom** in our prayer.

When we come to Prayer we are bringing our whole self – body, soul and mind. We have heard the words of Jesus 'Ask and you shall receive' .. but what do we ask for? During these days I guess it may be for good health for ourselves and others; for patience to accept the lockdowns and what that means. It is difficult for us to believe that God does know our own needs and anxieties, our hopes and our desires - for our lives are filled with those.

To enter into the space that requires us to choose wisely is a scary one! Solomon knew that he was young and inexperienced! Many of us cannot claim that, but we do need to choose wisely, particularly with today's overwhelming parade of choices offered in all walks of life.

One way is to ask the question 'Where does my treasure lie?' In today's Gospel Jesus gives us four parables each relating to a treasure. Whichever one appeals to us we can ponder on; if my choices are guided by my values reflected on what I treasure. The heart that is 'wise and shrewd' will make decisions after deep reflection.

The **Psalm** extols the value of God's law which, when we obey, is a treasure that brings true happiness; **Paul's letter to the Romans** affirms that a faithful follower will be justified and glorified in heaven.

In our isolation we are called to appreciate what is important in our lives. I think we have learned that much of what we thought was important can be done without. At least we can take time to reflect and pray for the **grace** to become closer to God during these difficult times.


