When evening came, the disciples went to him and said, 'This is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away, and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food.' Jesus replied, 'There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves.' But they answered, 'All we have with us is five loaves and two fish.' 'Bring them here to me,' he said. He gave orders that the people were to sit down on the grass; then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves he handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining, twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children.


REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Jesus nourishes us. In a world that is fraught with meaninglessness, he offers purpose; to a world that is stumbling in darkness and confusion, he provides direction. He satisfies the hungry heart; he enlivens the drooping spirit. Those

who follow Jesus will never be left to languish in the desert. If we but open our eyes, we will be amazed at bountifulness of nourishment that is provided for us. We will discover that God is magnanimous, even prodigal in giving, that God's generosity exceeds all of our expectations and our understanding. Furthermore, we are nourished by God through the ministry of each other, through the simple things of life, (distributing bread and gathering up the fragments): visiting the sick and consoling the grieving; caring for a child and giving aid to an elder; bagging groceries and directing a choir. If we but open our eyes, we will be astounded at how ordinary actions can satisfy our hunger and the hunger of others. Most amazing of all is that this nourishment is given freely; there was no thought of requiring payment. God simply invites: Come! All we have to do is reach out our hands to receive and we will never be sent away to find nourishment for ourselves. We will discover that a bond is established that endures. Jesus is filled with compassion, a compassion that is not a fleeting emotion, but an enduring attitude. Nothing can separate us from the love of Christ.

BREAD FOR THE JOURNEY

At our recent Chapter (we Srs of St Joseph) chose the quote taken from this Sunday's Gospel, 'Bring Me What You Have' to live into.

In many ways these words speak to all of us... Jesus had sought a lonely place to retire, to mourn his cousin, John the Baptist's death. But the crowds found him and he ministered to them. I am sure that

many of us have sought a place of peace and quiet to reflect on all that has happened to us this year. We may have found it difficult to do so and are perhaps exhausted from facing each new event. Do we realise that all Jesus is asking of us is to 'bring what we have' not anything extra... Jesus just wants us as we are Do we realise this?

In the First Reading God through Isaiah invites us, actually pleads with us to come to the sacred meal, which he offers for free, no stipulations. The Psalm praises God generously and with the Second Reading, turns our eyes to the feeding of the five thousand in the Gospel.

This miracle was a preparation for the greatest miracle which Jesus performed at the Last Supper... this miracle that represented Jesus's sacrifice on Calvary; one that is food for the soul and feeds all people till the end of time.

We need to really reflect on our Readings today as they are filled with such nourishing food which is life giving and refreshing for our souls.
