REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

What's in a Name?

Jesus had a sense of humour! Simon, son of Jonah, was far from being a rock solid supporter of Jesus. So Jesus gave him the nickname 'Rocky' which in the Greek is Petros.

Jesus puns with the nickname: 'You are Rocky and upon this rock I will build my church.' The natural personality of shifting sands was being transformed by the blessing just given (the only blessing bestowed upon an apostle by Jesus).

Notice that Jesus only makes promises about 'my church', not a church shaped by human imagination, e.g. modes of Roman Imperial rule or with a Eurocentric mindset.

Fortunately, we have a successor of St Peter responding to our Risen Lord's command to St Francis of Assisi, 'Rebuild my church'.

We could pause for a moment to pray that the Risen Lord showers the 265th successor of St Peter with every blessing so that the Church of Jesus the Christ continues to prevail over the forces of death which threaten humanity.

21st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME—A

WHO DO YOU SAY I AM?

Have we really answered Jesus' question honestly? Or have we depended on others to give answers.

When Peter responds with 'You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God' he was responding with the gift given him by the Heavenly Father...in other words it was his **personal discovery**. Our responses must be the same. If we truly believe that Jesus is who we say He is, our daily lives should bear witness to His truth, and bring His love to others. Let us not act impetuously, but with calm and sincere thought to declare who Jesus is for us.



This weeks' readings are a goldmine of references to what Jesus was revealing to Peter when He asked **that** question. Jesus was laying foundations for structures that will enable the community to function during the time when He will no longer be with them in the human form they have known.

The Reading from Isaiah takes the **key** of the House of David from Shebna to Eliakim and forecasts the handing of the **keys of the kingdom** to Peter and passed on to his successors where they are a **telling symbol** of the power to give entry into the kingdom of heaven.

The beautiful hymn of praise to the Romans gives us a taste of the depths of God. How wonderful that we are able to feast on these words and in our humility invited to meditate on these mysteries. Let us be grateful for that which is freely given.

Interestingly in the Gospel, Jesus uses the word **Church** when he responds to Peter's act of Faith, handing him the **keys** and naming him Peter (rock) on whom the church will be built. (This **word** is used only one other time in the New Testament. Mt 18:15-17) Jesus also warns the disciples not to tell anyone of this revelation because there was a lot more for them to learn before they could **accurately communicate** the full Messianic message. The suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus was yet to occur.

In thinking what may be **my response** let us truly be open to the honesty of our own reality. God loves me as I am. I cannot repeat that truth too often. Let my response be mine and not something we may have heard or read that can sometimes stop us from going deeper into relationship with our God. Be mindful that we have the abiding gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in our ponderings! God bless




OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS

SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY
30th AUGUST 2020

This year the Bishops statement focuses on Mental Health in Australia Today.

The Covid-19 pandemic is impacting the mental health of many members of our parishes, school and communities. In fact many of us will experience a mental health problem at some point. Understanding mental health will help us to be aware of those needing support. Our parishes, organisations and communities can be places of acceptance, care and healing, not places of rejection, judgement or stigma.

In the Social Justice Statement To Live Life to the Full: Mental Health in Australia Today, the Bishops welcome the de-institutionalisation of mental health care in Australia. However, without adequately funded community mental health services, there is a gap in the system through which people continue to fall. Social determinants including poverty, living conditions and personal security are significant contributors to mental ill-health. The statement highlights the experience of First Nations people and communities, asylum seekers and refugees, people who are homeless and those who are in prison.

The Bishops observe that "our society tends to draw away from, or to push away, those who confront us with our frailties and limitations" which is completely at odds with the story of Jesus who "takes on the frailty of the human condition and draws near to those who are sick or who have disabilities, are marginalised or despised".

People living with mental ill-health are part of the Body of Christ—us and not them and share equally in Jesus' promise of the fullness of life (Jn 10:10)

We are all called to reject stigmatisation and work for transformation of policies and services that meets the need of the poorest and most marginalised in our society.

St Pius X

Pope Pius X was born Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto on 2nd June 1835 and was head of the Catholic Church from August 1903 to his death in 1914.

Pius X is known for vigorously opposing modernist interpretations of Catholic doctrine, promoting liturgical reforms and scholastic philosophy and theology. He initiated the preparation of the 1917 Code of Canon Law, the first comprehensive and systemic work of its kind.

He died on 20th August 1914 and was canonised on May 29th 1954 by Pope Pius XII.
