We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

Look, the bridegroom comes. Go out to meet him.

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five of them were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are

going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate The Hour and the Time

Israel was often portrayed as a bride in Jewish scriptures. So, the question was: 'When would the Bridegroom the Anointed One of God, the Christ – appear?' Jesus' warning is to the attendants of the bride: 'Be alert, be vigilant, be prepared.' Some (the five foolish attendants) did miss the moment: the earthly ministry of Jesus of Nazareth. But his warning is also for the Catholic Church which is the new Bride of Christ. We are the attendants to the Bride and the imperative applies to us also: Be alert, be vigilant. Be prepared for the eruption, the intervention of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Bridegroom, into our history, into our moment of time. For example, is Christ coming to meet us in the modern movements which demand to hold authority accountable, or which press for just recognition of women? We can foolishly remain in the dark or we can wisely try to throw light on these questions. Only then we will be able to discern whether indeed it is the Lord who is approaching. 

Wisdom is available to all who seek her and is eager to meet her pursuer more than halfway. (Wisdom is often referred to as feminine!) Wisdom is such a gift.. it is there for our taking. Wisdom helps us to go deeper to see as God sees. The First Reading gives us the desire to seek it .. for comfort, strength and consolation! It is there to help us in our troubles and anxieties.

How often someone comes into our minds whom we perceive as being a wise person. What draws us to them? There seems to be a serenity that surrounds them. They may not be the most educated, wealthy nor popular person but there is something that attracts. They make wise decisions! How often have we prayed the Psalm .. 'my body pines for you', perhaps not in those specific words but wanting the comfort of 'resting' in the shadow of Gods winas.

St Paul is trying to tell the Thessalonians that the righteous will always be with the Lord and not to worry or fear death. We must be patient, keeping the flame of faith alive in our hearts. The promise of the Resurrection is their consolation.

The five foolish virgins in the Gospel let slip their preparation for the bridegroom's return and hence were locked out of the banquet. Jesus told these parables to help us understand that it is wise to be prepared for God calling us home at a time we know not!

At the end of Eucharist we are told to 'Go in peace to love and serve the Lord' By taking these words to heart we have with us always the 'oil' required for salvation.

So the need to ask for and receive the gift of Wisdom is the way to always calmly walk in the Presence of God and to being open to the small miracles that await us each day. The alternative is that we find ourselves overly stressed and worried thereby missing the daily opportunities for grace.
