A reading from the prophet Isaiah Oh that you would tear the heavens apart and come down.

You, Lord, yourself are our Father, Our Redeemer is your ancient name. Why, Lord, leave us to stray from your ways and harden our hearts against fearing you? Return, for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your inheritance. Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down – at your Presence the mountains would melt. 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REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Timely Living and the End of History

Our Lord portrays himself as the Master who goes away on a journey. It is certain that he will return, even if no-one in his household knows exactly when. That is *our* situation. What do we do in anticipation?

Our Lord, the Master, indicates we have a choice. We can close our eyes and enter into the world of dreams where we create our own fantasy futures, or we can stay awake and alert to do what Our Lord wants us to do: 'He left his servants in charge, giving to each his work.'

You and me – his servants – have a particular role or work in and for this phase of human history. A deep down intuition, prompted by the Holy Spirit, indicates what this is. We must be true to this assignment. We could take a moment to pray that, when the Lord returns, we may hear: 'Come, good and *faithful* servant, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world.'

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It is the beautiful task of advent to awaken in all of us memories of goodness and thus to open doors of hope

STAY AWAKE!!!

As we begin another liturgical year, we focus on the coming of Christ. We wait for his coming in our own lives; we wait for his coming at Christmas; and we await His second coming at the end of time.

In the first reading Isaiah is pleading with the people to stay true to God's words and not wander away and become hard hearted! He recalls all the wondrous works that had been done for them and reminds them that God is the potter and we are but clay in God's hands.

St Paul talks about our faithful God as he thanks the Corinthians, and in turn us, for the teaching and example that we give to those with whom we live, work and play. Do we value the witness that our everyday life gives? Our faithfulness is what gives people around us hope! St Paul exclaims with gratitude that this faithful God will provide and go on providing the Spiritual Gifts until the Second Coming.

In the Gospel Jesus asks us to 'Stay awake'! What does this mean. Are we not to get any sleep? No of course not! This watchfulness, this alertness, this vigilance is above all, LOVE. We live our lives as a response to this Love so we will be ready and not 'asleep' when we are called home.

During Advent the word 'waiting' is often referred to! We experience this in our daily lives in so many ways. How do I cope with waiting? Waiting for an appointment, in line at the supermarket, for results of a medical condition, for sleep to come, for 2020 to end, for many things. Perhaps I need to see my waiting as a prayer where I can practice patience and join with all those who wait in our world enduring oppression of all kinds, those who struggle to work for solidarity and reconciliation. Advent is a time of hope – let us pray that this hope grows stronger each day through this Holy Season.

Come, Lord Jesus. Give me the grace to make this

day fit for You to see and may I be ready at any moment to meet You face to face.

THE JESSE TREE



This year our school, St Bernard's, has prepared a Jesse Tree to mark the journey to Christmas through symbol & Scripture.

The Jesse Tree helps us connect the custom of decorating Christmas trees to the events leading to Jesus' birth. The Jesse tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out of the stock

of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of King David. We adorn a Jesse tree with illustrated ornaments that represent the people, prophesies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. The ornaments of the Jesse tree tell the story of God in the Old Testament, connecting the Advent season with the faithfulness of God across four thousand years of history. Each day from December 1 the children will come and place an ornament and the related Scripture verse on the Jesse Tree.

PARISH ADVENT PROGRAM 2020


The Parish Advent Program will commence in the Church meeting room on Wednesday 25th November and continue on the following three Wednesdays:


