**OPENING SCHOOL MASS AND STAFF COMMISSIONING** 

Our Parish Community is large. Stretching from Nelligen to Mogo and **V** from Durras to Tomakin. On the physical site, we have the School, the Convent, the Men's Shed, the Church itself and Maranatha Lodge. Our hope is to commit a weekend to each of these components this year. To begin, we dedicate this weekend to our school, a key component of our parish community. We welcome parents, teachers and our school children to the celebration of the Eucharist where we gather to offer special praises, prayers and to obtain God's blessing as we inaugurate the 2019 Academic Year.

During this school year, the boys and girls in Year Two will make their 1<sup>st</sup> Reconciliation, Year Three will make 1<sup>st</sup> Eucharist and Year Six will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. We look forward to having more class masses on Friday and celebrating reconciliation in the context of the class room. And to provide additional pastoral care and support within the school, in order to bring out the best in the children entrusted to us in a safe environment.

Providentially today, Jesus instructs his disciples in the paradoxical blessedness of poverty, hunger, sorrow and persecution known as the *Beatiudes*. "Blessed are those who are poor, hungry, weeping, hated, excluded, insulted and denounced,' because in poverty, we recognize our dependence on God and others; in hunger, God's providence; in sorrow for sins, reconciliation with God; and in persecution, the true joy of standing for the Faith with heroic convictions. These are the core realities that we often share.

Significantly, what makes one blessed is not simply poverty or hunger or sadness or suffering for the Faith but living these in the context of our commitment to Jesus and his spirit of sharing. Also, true blessedness lies in the awareness that we are all children of a loving Heavenly Father and that we will be happy only when we share

our blessings with our brothers and sisters in need, and when we work to uplift them, thus declaring our "option for the poor," as Jesus did. Contrary to the popular belief that, wealth, health, power and influence are the source of true happiness. The word "beatitude" means "blessedness" in a double sense: both enjoying God's favor and enjoying true or supreme happiness. Let's be a blessing to one another this School Year.
