## First Reading Ex 20:1-17

A reading from the book of Exodus The Law was given through Moses.

God spoke all these words. He said, 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

'You shall have no gods except me. 'You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth: you shall not bow down to them or serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God and I punish the father's fault in the sons, the grandsons, and the great-grandsons of those who hate me; but I show kindness to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

'You shall not utter the name of the Lord vour God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it.

'Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath for the Lord your God. You shall do no work on that day, neither you nor your son nor your daughter nor your servants, men or women, not your animals nor the stranger who lives with you. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that these hold, but on the seventh day he rested; that is why the Lord has blessed the sabbath day and made it sacred.

'Honour your father and your mother so that you may have a long life in the land that the Lord your God has given to you. 'You shall not kill.

'You shall not commit adultery.

'You shall not steal.

'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.

'You shall not covet your neighbour's house. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his servant, man or woman, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is his.'

### **Gospel** Jn 2:13-25

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeonsellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market." Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passo-

ver many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him. *The Gospel of the Lord*

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#### **REFLECTION** by Fr Michael Tate Where does God really dwell?

The Ten Commandments are badly named. Rather, they are the Ten Responses which should characterise a liberated people, freed from slavery by 'the Lord, your God'.

By the time Jesus came on the scene, the Temple in Jerusalem was no longer a fit dwelling place for a God who desires to free people from oppression and exploitation. To the contrary, Jesus saw the Temple ideology as placing undue burdens and shackles on people.

His anger at this erupted in dramatic street theatre. His overturning of the tables of the money-changers signalled the overturning of the Temple system.

What Our Lord revealed to uncomprehending authorities was that His body was the true sanctuary. The body of Jesus of Nazareth is the dwelling place of God, the habitation of the Lord God who liberates people. In short, God's sanctuary is not a place, but a person.

We could take a moment to pray, using the Ten Responses to review and guide our reflection and practice as we move towards Easter. This will help us to celebrate the enigmatic saying: 'Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it again.'

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Together with Christ's body. our bodies are this temple... Let yourselves be built up in unity that you may not fall in ruins

# Third Sunday of Lent -YEAR B

**M**any of us grew up with the 'you must not' or 'must do' mentality of the Commandments. We completely missed the fact that they were really a guide to life! .. a way that would model before all nations of the world what it means to live out the Creator's true intent for human beings.

When Jesus was asked which is the greatest Commandment in the law? He asked us to look at the Commandments in the light of Loving God and loving our neighbor. I believe that helps us to understand that God was about love not fear.

As we listen or read them today, use them as an examination of conscience. Understood wisely they are signposts that enable us to be the best person we can be: fulfilling our relationship with God and enshrining values at home, in society and in our workplace.

Can we, with the Psalmist, see the Commandments as 'words of everlasting life?'

St Paul in Corinthians tries to get the people to see the Cross as a way of redemption not a failure! For those who **believe**, the Cross is a sign of **love** not power.

In the cleansing of the Temple we see Jesus who is on fire with 'love' for His Father's House. The 'sellers' had desecrated this sacred place and made it impossible for the **faithful** Jews to pray and worship. Is this a sign for us to 'clear out' what is preventing us from being open to hear God calling us? Let us look deeply into our own lives and see what needs 'clearing out' in our lives to free up the space to let God in!

How is our Lenten journey going? Are we consciously aware of what has changed in our lives and how prepared we are to continue to make the changes necessary so that we can truly enter fully into the Holy Week Mysteries in a couple of weeks time? God bless Sr Marie



# HOPE THROUGH BEING VUILNERABLE

Being vulnerable is not valued very much in our society today but indeed it is the call of the Gospel in our lives. Being vulnerable opens our lives to possibility - being HOPE for others.

In the words of St Oscar Romero "A church that doesn't provoke any crises, a gospel that doesn't unsettle, a word of God that doesn't get under anyone's skin, a word of God that doesn't touch the real sin of the society in which it is proclaimed - what Gospel is that?'

As we reach the mid-point of our Lenten Journey, perhaps we might be struggling with our Lenten resolutions - we are vulnerable. How do we move from vulnerability to Hope? Instead of remonstrating with ourselves, we are reminded that during Lent as we take stock and renew our faith,

"in the spiritual life, we are meant to prod our souls to regular discipline only so that in doing so our hearts will be softened to serve those whom Jesus served. The gentle Jesus wants clean hearts from us, not just sacrifice, and deep-down basic commitment. (Joan Chittister: In God's Holy Light)
