Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Can the Dalai Lama be saved?

'[People] from east and west, north and south . . . will feast in the Kingdom of God.' Amongst those people, will there be Buddhists, Muslims, Hindus, atheists?

The surprising answer of Catholic Christianity is: 'Yes, but always through the working of the Holy Spirit of Our Lord Jesus Christ, who can prompt the heart of *any* person *any*-where at *any* time with divine grace so that that person strives to lead a life of

compassion and justice and not harming innocent creatures.' Obviously, this work of the Holy Spirit could encompass millions if not billions of people who have never heard the Gospel. If the slogan: 'No salvation outside the Church' is taken to mean no-one can be saved unless he/she is a baptised member of the Catholic Church then it is a heresy explicitly condemned by Popes.

Nevertheless, we must pray and work for the conversion of all people so that they might have the advantage of all the aids of Word and Sacrament which we draw on as direction and strength on our journey towards the destiny which God desires for each one of us. We could pause for a moment to acknowledge the boundless mercy of God, but also praying that all peoples might share our privilege of participating in that Holy Communion which is the foretaste


This week- end we celebrate our patron saint: Saint Bernard of Clairvaux who was born in 1090 in Burgundy in France, and died August 20, 1153 in Clairvaux Abbey, Clairvaux, Champagne, France at the age of 63 years. His feast day is celebrated on August 20 every year.

He was born into the noble families of Burgundy and had five brothers and one sister. At school he was interested in literature, rhetoric and devotion to Mary the Mother of God. He lived a life of solitude and praver.

At 18, when his mother died, he joined the Citeaux Monastery, near Dijon with 30 other young men and lived in community following the Gospel and the rule of St Benedict.

Bernard's influence on his family saw his father and five brothers all enter The Citeaux Abbey and his sister joined the Benedictine Order of Religious Sisters. In 1128 St Bernard took a central role in Church administration matters especially during the Council of Troyes. He composed the rule for the Knights Templar, which became an ideal for Christian nobility.

He had strong influence in civil affairs when he defended the rights of the Church against interference by Princes and Kings. Bernard helped to mediate a Schism between two rival popes, Pope



He founded 163 monasteries in various parts of Europe and emphasized the importance of 'Lectio Divina' and contemplation for the monks. He had a very strong devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary

He was canonized on Jan 18, 1174 by Pope Alexander 111 in Rome. In 1830. St Bernard was named Doctor of the Church. On May 24, 1953 during the 800th anniversary of his death Pope Pius X11 called St Bernard **Doctor Mellifluous** for his eloquence.

St. Bernard of Clairvaux has written several hymns, poems and books. He is the patron saint of Cistercians monks, candle makers, and beekeepers.
