This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means 'God-is-with-us'. When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Just Man Dreaming

Joseph could not ignore Mary's pregnancy, but he had an exceptional large-heartedness, so that he preserved a future for Mary even though she had apparently wronged him. If he had gone to sleep in a frame of mind to avenge his honour, he would not have been ready to have the deepest levels of his consciousness stirred in the way God wanted. In the deep sleep of a just and good man, Joseph was enlightened as to the divine dimension of Mary's pregnancy. The old cycle of human history, literally generation after generation, was being broken. Something utterly new had happened. You and I are just as likely to receive an intuition as to God's plan for us in the depths of sleep: who we really are, who we are destined to be, where we fit in to God's plan for transforming the whole of creation. When we get these instructive moments in our sleep, what can we do when we wake up? We can do what Joseph did: get up and do what is needed to fulfil the message. We could pause for a moment to thank Joseph for showing what dreams can be made of. Tonight might be the night!

Saying YES to God -**People of Honour Supporting Others Quietly**

This weekend's Gospel of Matthew shines the light on the birth of Jesus through a focus on **Joseph** who is often perhaps just the assumed quiet, yet faithful and faith filled person in the tableau. Matthew breaks open the dilemma of Joseph, confronted by the mystery of Mary 'conceiving what is in her by the Holy Spirit'. The Scripture tells us that Joseph responded to the message of the Angel by 'taking his wife home'. Joseph responded to God with an open, but yet what must have been puzzled heart - he put his trust in God.

Emmanuel – God with us!

Who are the quiet people of honour who are the Face of God in our world today and throughout human history - who manifest the Advent aspirations of

Patience - Waiting - Expectant Joy - Trust - Mystery -Honour

Let us open our eyes and ears and hearts to these people of quiet action, presence and response in our midst as our world continues to struggle with many natural and human disasters. As we do so we are exhorted to reflect on these qualities within ourselves – the words of St Augustine can perhaps assist in this.

When Augustine says: "You have made us for yourself, Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you," he is, of course, pointing out the reason why God would have made us this way. And, as his prayer indicates, the ultimate value of longing and waiting as we do in Advent, lies precisely in its incessant nature, by never letting us rest with anything less than the infinite and eternal it guarantees that we will seek God or be frustrated and continue longing and being restless.

Longing shapes the soul in many ways, particularly by helping create the space within us where God can be born. Longing creates in us the stable and the manger of Bethlehem. It is the trough into which God can be born.

May the quiet and loyal YES of Joseph who actively supported the generous YES of Mary, resonate with you and bring you every blessing of this holy season.
