# SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER-YEAR A



The First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles describes the nature of the early Christian community - the fidelity to Jesus' teaching, living life together as a community, the centrality of the Eucharist and prayer. This reading emphasises the impact that this witness of a living community had on the broader community – contributing to the common good as taught in Catholic Social Teaching, inspired by the Scriptures.

The emphasis on **community** is central to how we understand ourselves as Christians. As scholars state ' the key actor in the growth and spread of the Gospel is the community of faith - Christ present in the Spirit in the body of the faithful' (Draper, 2023).

When the celebrant proclaims at the end of Mass – 'Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life' - we are impelled by our Baptism and by the way we live our lives in our families, in our workplaces, in our communities and in broader society to serve the common god of all humanity.

This is challenging and sometimes we feel unworthy or doubtful just as Thomas was when Jesus appeared after the Resurrection as recounted in this weekend's Gospel from John. In the Gospel it refers to ,many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw - where do we see those signs today? Thomas believed because he could see and touch Jesus to which Jesus replied - 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe'.

The gift of **faith** is indeed a gift – it is God's gift to each of us and is strengthened by our commitment and witness to each other - our willingness to 'walk together' and to remember always that 'God is on the journey too'.

In this season of Easter let us be Alleluia people – the Easter light of Christ shining through us in our everyday - brought to courage in the words of the Psalm 'Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting'


