

Marriage breakdown is a traumatic experience for all those concerned. The Church reaches out in support



## **REFLECTION** by Fr Michael Tate The Eves Have It

When Jesus says to Simon, Andrew, James and John 'I will make you into fishers of men', then, amongst the many levels of meaning they would have heard the allusion to Ezekiel 29:3-5. Jesus was telling them that he was creating a society of liberated human beings, called the 'Kingdom of God'. This would involve struggle against powerful elites, the pharaohs of this world, who oppress and enslave people. It would be as dangerous and demand as much energy as required to haul a crocodile out of the Nile. Yet they did so, 'straightaway'.

# LITURGY OF THE WORD Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Year

First Reading Jonah 3:1-5. 10

A reading from the prophet Jonah The Ninevites renounced their evil ways.

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told vou to.'
