

Worldwide in the news and in our community we witness the longing and desire of men and women, raising their voices time and time again, waiting for a Liberator. We wait for liberation from war, sickness, loneliness, depression, stress, and impoverishment – a new life!

We are waiting, they announce, for a Messiah, who will free us from hatred and oppression, from racism and war – a Messiah who will let peace and justice take their rightful place.' ['The Wounded Healer' by Henri Nouwen, page 81] In the same chapter Nouwen speaks of the Liberator sitting among the poor, the forgotten ones, his wounds are a sign of hope – he proclaims today is the day of liberation. Nouwen goes on to say: 'The master is coming, not tomorrow but today, not next year, but this year, not after all our misery is past, but in the middle of it, not in another place but right here where we are standing.' 
Jesus our Liberator!

The Season of Lent closes with Holy Week. The Liturgy is not afraid of tragedy. It invites us to live the hour of Jesus, that hour at once dark and glorious for which He said He had come. We follow his every footstep, from the triumphant entry in Jerusalem acclaimed by the crowd of his followers, to the loneliness of Golgotha where he is abandoned by almost everyone, even those he himself had chosen and for whom he gives his life. Everything happens guickly and seems to collapse around Him. Yet, even in what seems complete abandonment and ruin. – 'Father. why have you abandoned me?' Jesus with outstretched arms, encourages and gathers to himself all of humanity and the universe. All seems lost, all is about to begin!

During this week we are especially invited to listen to His voice as recalled in Psalm 95:7-9 and believe our ministry to one another is a sign of hope, a source of liberation in Christ.
