

WHO DO THE PEOPLE SAY I AM? BUT YOU! WHO DO YOU SAY IAM?

The Gospel this week is yet another example of Mark's indefatigable writing style. He opens the door to another episode in the public life of Jesus. As Jesus and His disciples travel, interacting with crowds of sometimes curious bystanders, Mark is exposing the disciples to His role/ purpose in spreading the good news and what is required of them as believers and true followers. The disciples needed to understand that they could face challenges along the way. Do those same challenges apply to us in this, our modern day world and life?

Even though Jesus had been relentlessly talking with the people and His disciples, it was clear that many had not yet realised who He was, hence His asking "Who do people think I am?" The people were hoping for a political, militaristic leader who would free them from Roman occupation rather than the Messiah which means "the anointed" one. Peter had great difficulty accepting a suffering Messiah but once Jesus explains that He was "destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected ... and put to death" Peter and the disciples began to understand that being a follower involves the mystery of suffering- the way of Jesus means understanding that His way leads to the cross.

Richard Rohr and Joseph Marcos suggest that the purpose of Mark's gospel was to remind Christians who acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah that He is also the suffering servant. Is Mark suggesting that the full meaning of Christ is elusive? We need to fully understand that His way can lead to conflict, personal suffering, change of heart and mind as well as a positive belief that God loves us unconditionally.

Just as Jesus was trying to lead the disciples to a deeper level of understanding, living, wisdom and faith, we too can take from Mark a greater understanding of suffering, servanthood and trust in God. What might this mean for us in our world and lives today?

W hat does it mean to be a Christian? Following Jesus means accepting His path even when it is difficult. We are reminded today of FAITH and what it entails. From St Thomas Aguinas "The truth of Faith includes not only inner belief but outward profession, not only the declaration of Faith but actions that demonstrate that Faith."

We are encouraged to live out our faith in everyday life. It takes courage and hope in the reality of our life. We need to trust, be attentive to God's voice and be ready to support others in their faith journey. Being a disciple, following Jesus means accepting His path even when it is difficult.

This week we can look at and ponder the two questions -

Who do people say that I am? Who do you say that I am?

Veronica Lawson RSM gives us some points to ponder - " Do we simply go along with what the people say about Jesus? Are we like Peter who has the right language but only partial insight. Or do we have the wisdom to seek a deeper understanding of the identity of Jesus?"


