### Sister Pauline sgs – Street Angel of Sydney

We all know someone in our life who freely gives of their time, love and service to others. We often say 'they give their all!' Sr. Pauline Fitz-Walter, a Good Samaritan Sister, was such a woman. In the latter years of her life Sr. Pauline set up St Francis Houses in Sydney. living with and supporting people with mental illness and drug/alcohol addiction. It was frequently said of her when you were in her presence 'she devoted 100% of her attention to you.' Bishop David Cremin



stated 'She had a deep love of God ...and a deep, deep love of people who were suffering. She was a woman of deep prayer. And, that, I do believe, helped her to cope with the madness of living with all kinds of people.' Sr. Pat Snudden rsj said of her: 'she had an incredible capacity to give ...she had an incredible trust in **Divine Providence** ... she had a great fighting spirit. She would stick up for the down and out. She was fearless.' Sr. Pauline's Service came from her relationship with Jesus and living out of Gospel values. If, like Sr. Pauline we want to grow in holiness and honour God with our life, then we must be single minded in the practice of mercy. As Mother Teresa of Calcutta says: 'God depends on us to love the world and to show how much he loves it.

## The Widow who gave of her all.

In today's short Gospel: Mark 12:38-44, Jesus judgement of the Scribes is based. at least in part, on their inner motivation – as they wander around in their ostentatious robes, thinking themselves more important than anyone else, saying long prayers, while insisting on being first. They seem to have lost their way to God and his kingdom. Already in Mark's Gospel Jesus has already told the people 'whoever wants to be first must be last and servant of all' [Mark 10:35], and is the basis on which the judgement of Jesus rests in today's Gospel. Jesus observes how a poor widow who puts a tiny amount into the treasury, gives everything she has. Behind this tiny amount of money Jesus sees the huge generosity of heart. In a real way it is a summary of the whole Gospel - for God looks at the heart and its readiness to give generously. This Scripture text of Mark is about perspective and re-evaluation. Those things that are valued in the Kingdom of God differ from that in wider society. Our work for the Lord may be simple and unknown to all but a very few. It is known to God and in God's sight. This is enough reward. Today as we reflect on this Gospel may we pray **St Ignatius Prayer**: 'Take O Lord and receive my entire liberty, my memory, my understanding and my whole will. All that I am and all that I possess you have given me: I surrender it all to you to be disposed of according to your will. Give me only your love and your grace; with these I will be rich enough, and will desire nothing more."




