What are we to make of the famous reply of Jesus to Pilate: 'My kingdom is not of this world'? Left there, it sounds as though Jesus is talking about a realm which is far removed from terrestrial concerns. Perhaps our Blessed is he who inherits the king- task as his followers is to meditate dom of David our Father; blessed is into a blissful nothingness, to live

It is a poor translation, and it should read: 'My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this A reading from the holy Gospel accord- world, my followers would have fought to stop my being handed over.' Of all the ways in which our Lord could have contrasted his realm with all the other ways in which societies are ruled, he chose a contrast about the use of force. Rather, his reign springs from his Father's will that humanity should live together in a realm of non-violence.

We can easily criticise ISIL's blasphemous use of barbaric violence in the supposed service of religion. It is the most extreme opposite of Our Lord's teaching which He embodied in his practice. But, even for us, the challenge is there to restrain tooready resort to armed violence and to am a king. I was born for this, I came humanely moderate its exercise where it is used to protect the innocent.

IS CHRIST YOUR KING?

Jesus told Pilate: 'My kingdom is not of this world' So what does that mean? If we look at the monarchies that still exist, they range from figure heads to total autocrats. In Daniel's vision 7:14: And He was given dominion, glory, and kingship, that the people of every nation and language should serve Him. In other words, He is King of Kings and we are to honour and obey Him.

He is supreme king over all peoples and nations but his kingship is not coercive as worldly kingdoms are. We have free will and can accept or reject Him as our King. So, though He has no army to keep us in line, what is it that He requires from us?

Again unlike worldly kings – we are invited to have a personal relationship with Him. Our personal relationship requires several things:

- * Obedience to His commandments, which are formed to help us get the most out of life, to be at peace, not to restrict us.
- To have a personal relationship with Him through daily prayer, Mass and sacraments
- Honouring His name and person we should not take His name in vain nor use it as an exclamation. We should also give Him the reverence of His kingship – bow/genuflect when we enter and leave the church and bow before His presence when we approach the altar to receive Him in the Eucharist. We give this honour to worldly kings – how much more should we give it to Jesus?

In Pius XI's encyclical on Christ the King, he explains clearly "that as long as individuals and states refused to submit to the rule of our Savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations." History has proved the reality of that statement.

We may not be able to influence the world but in our homes and workplaces we can easily influence those around us by showing our respect for our king by following His simple guidelines: Love God and Love one another. Treat Jesus and all others with respect.

As a child I learnt from the old green catechism that my job was 'To know, love and serve Him here on earth and to see and enjoy Him forever in heaven.'

Our challenge: Can we truly allow Christ to be our King and rule our space on this planet?

Do we honour Him with the bow to royalty when we enter church or receive His Body & Blood?




