Gospel *Matthew 2:1-12*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew We have come from the East to worship the king.

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the Stars and Seekers after Truth east.
