<image/>	 "Yet, it was not simply the absence of the sun that caused this midnight. Another type of "darkness" was at play: inhospitality. "The Holy Family, at least at this crucial moment of salvation history, were homeless due to the absence of hospitality in Bethlehem." Reinforcing that the giving of love and the shining of light are not simply an academic or a sentimental exercise, Archbishop Christopher highlighted the practical charity done by groups such as St Vincent de Paul and others in the Canberra community. They help relieve homelessness, hunger and anguish for "the lost, the least and the last," especially at Christmas Time.
