What is a Plenary Council?

A Plenary Council is the highest formal gathering of <u>all</u> local churches at all levels: parishes, Deaneries and dioceses within a country. This Council is called by the Bishops Conference to chart the future direction for the Church based on her particular needs. The current Plenary Council will determine legislation which will be binding for the Catholic Church in Australia.

Who are the participants?

All Christ's faithful including you. Thus the Bishops are asking <u>all</u> to participate in the Listening Sessions around Australia.
