Live-Streamed Parish Mass

This is via the parish Facebook account, every Saturday at 6.00pm. Search for Our Lady of Perpetual Help-North Belconnen or enter @ OLoPHNBelco in the Facebook search field. Mass is livestreamed on Saturday at 6pm. The recording can be viewed anytime afterwards.

1. Churches may now be open but will be restricted to no more than 10 people in the building at any time.

2. Mass may be celebrated for no more than 10 people, excluding those conducting the service.

3. Funerals celebrated inside the church building are restricted to 20 people, excluding those conducting the service. 4. Funerals celebrated outside the church building are restricted to 30 people, excluding those conducting the service.

5. Weddings may now be celebrated with 10 people, excluding those conducting the ceremony.

These gatherings are permitted with the physical distancing rule of 1.5 metres. No physical sign of peace is permitted and the current protocols for Holy Communion remain in place.

Parish Protocols regarding Covid-19 as of 8 May 2020

The Celebration of the Eucharist Due to the restriction of a maximum of ten people, (excluding the celebrant), being permitted to gather in the church, Masses in our parish will not recommence until the next stage of the Covid-19 restrictions.

Prayers and Devotions in the Church Groups of up to ten people who already possess a key to the church, may gather for prayers or devotions, observing the social distancing rule of 1.5 metres. For individuals who would like to pray privately in the church, please contact the parish office to arrange a time for the church to be opened.

Planned Giving Arrangements

The parish sincerely thanks all parishioners who contribute to the Planned Giving Program, particularly to those who have continued to support the Parish during these difficult days. We recognise too that there are families who have been impacted by work restrictions and consequently may not be able to contribute at this time. Our prayers are with you all. With the closure of the Church for weekly Mass, our income has been significantly reduced to only that of Planned Giving and while we are able to reduce some expenses, the reduced income does not cover all the remaining expenses.

With such uncertainty as to future income, we would like to ask those parishioners who contribute through the envelopes to again consider moving to direct debit contributions. This would not only assist in ensuring a regular cash flow but would also cut down on the administration work involved and reduce the need to handle cash.
