"Jesus spoke a parable about a Pharisee and a tax collector." Luke 18:9-14

Jesus tells the story of two men who came to pray in the temple. One man, a Pharisee, believed that he was a good and righteous man who was guaranteed entry to heaven because he did everything that the law asked of him. He stood in the temple so that everyone could see him praying. He thanked God that he was a good man and not like other men; men like the tax collector.

The tax collector was praying, but he was praying quietly and afraid to lift his eyes to God. He was praying for forgiveness for his sins, for the things that he had done that were wrong and for the things that he should have done but did not do.

Jesus warns us that we should worry about our own thoughts and deeds and not compare them to what we think others are like. We should not make a big fuss about the things we do so that people notice us. We should work hard, do what we should do, care for others, help them and avoid doing things that are hurtful and wrong.

We should pray to God to thank him from the bottom of our hearts for all that he has given us. We should also pray to him asking for forgiveness when we do something wrong.
