
Prayer Gathering St Matthew's Church 8 April 2018

All: Jesus, the source of love, hear our prayer.

We pray for those in the healing professions. May God continue to give them wisdom, compassion and strength to support those who have suffered sexual abuse. Jesus hear us.

All: Jesus, who brings healing and hope to all, hear our prayer.

We pray for all people.

May the Spirit of Wisdom enlighten us to put an end to acts of violence and abuse, in all forms. Jesus hear us.

Gospel according to Matthew 11:28-30

Tree Planting - a weeping cherry tree

The tree reminds us of the reality of the abuse - it is based in reality, in the earth.

The tree has a few leaves that have turned colour - reminding us that seasons come and go, and while the tree will soon be bare, it will flower in Spring time, a sign of hope.

The tree represents the children, families and community that have been betrayed, but continue to have life and to grow.

Ultimately the tree is a sign of hope, of life -

For children to be safe and loved and cared for.

For families to feel confident that all adults will protect their children.

For our community to ensure all children and other vulnerable people are nurtured and kept safe in our midst.

Blessing of the Plaque

The words on the plaque are:

In memory of children and families who have suffered as a result of sexual abuse in this parish, and as a pledge of our commitment to the healing process and to the safety of children, now and in the

future.

Symbolic Action - sprinkling with ashes/water/petals.

Concluding Prayer

When faced with great difficulty we can often be at a total loss for words.

But the Spirit of God can express even our sighs to the heart of God.

Gentle Jesus, shepherd of peace

hear our cries of distress over the harm done to children in our parish, and their families.

Breathe wisdom into our prayers,

soothe restless hearts with hope,

steady shaken spirits with faith.

Grant us courage and wisdom, humility and grace, so that we may act with justice and find peace in you.

May all people who come to visit this memorial tree at St Matthew's Church find a sense of peace and reflection and resolve.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.
