The pattern of our human life and death is reflected in Christ. And it is through the resurrection that we need never fear death ever again. We follow this pattern each Easter. But this year, so much of what we knew and were has died in the fires and COVID-19. A newer us, and a newer world, is emerging and rising in us and around us. As we continue to grow from the challenges of this year we may wonder what has died in us that needs to remain at rest? What has come to new life that we are best to give thanks for and allow to blossom? October is also mental health month. How might this pattern of dying and rising give us pause for mental and spiritual growth?

National Carers Week (II October to 17 October) is about recognising and celebrating the outstanding contribution unpaid carers make to our nation. There are over 2.7 million family and friend carers in Australia providing 36 million hours of care and support every week to a family member or friend who has a disability, mental illness, drug and/or alcohol dependency, chronic condition, terminal illness or who is frail. The replacement value of that unpaid care is \$1.1 billion per week. According to the National Centre for Pastoral Research 2016 figures, there were 505,087 Catholics providing unpaid care.

Updated Archdiocesan Protocols - COVID 19

Effective Friday 9am Friday 9 October 2020 - ACT Parishes Only

Mass Numbers

- Apply one person per 4sqm² rule.
- Maximum number of people at Mass, inside or outside, is 200.

Comments

- Most parish churches will not be able to have 200, since Churches are not big enough.
- Measure your Church to determine the maximum number of people permitted utilising the 4sqm² rule.
- Most Churches will be able to accommodate around 100 people; including our parish churches.

COVID Safety Plan

Parishes must have a COVID Safety Plan. It includes:

- Register worshippers for contact tracing and keep record for 28 days
- Name and contact details of persons
- Churches must clearly display occupancy allowance at the entrance
- Carefully manage the entry, exit and flow of people
- Physical distancing of 1.5 metres between each group or household is required.
- Increase the frequency of cleaning for high touch areas and restroom facilities.
- The use of collection plates and other shared equipment should be avoided during services.
- Limit the use of books, if possible. If not, ensure they are cleaned between each use.
- Choirs are to remain at least 2 metres away from the congregation
- Choir members are to be kept to an absolute minimum and are to maintain physical distancing of at least 2 metres from each other when singing.
- Musicians should remain physically distanced from the congregation.

Giving & Receiving

The Archdiocese is transitioning to cashless collection of money. Recent events have quickened the pace of change.

As per Archdiocesan Protocols, there will be **no more collection plates at Mass**. There will be collection points set up in both of our Churches (just inside the doors leading you from the foyer into the Church) to place cash or planned giving envelopes **before** Mass or **after** Mass.
