From the Liturgy Committee ... All Souls Day

All Souls' Day is celebrated by Catholics around the world, as well as a few other Christian denominations. On All Souls' Day, believers remember and pray for the souls of people in Purgatory— where the faithful who have died repent for their sins before going to Heaven.

In fact, November is a special time to focus our prayer on the holy souls, those who have gone before us in faith. In some places and cultures, people go to the cemetery to visit and pray at the graves of their loved ones. Some people set up family altars and display photos of their deceased loved ones; others write their deceased family member's names on special candles and some cultures cook special food during the month of November to celebrate and remember their deceased loved ones and friends.

Most parishes have a Book of Remembrance or a special list that is displayed and people are invited to record the names of deceased family members and friends for whom Masses are offered throughout November. Special envelopes are available to make an offering.

In a homily on All Souls' Day in 2018, Pope Francis said, "Today is a day of memory that takes us back to our roots. It is also a day of hope. It reminds us of what we can expect: the hope of encountering the love of the Father."

We are encouraged to pray this special prayer daily or whenever we pray: Eternal Rest grant unto them (him/her),O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them (him/her).May they (he/she) rest in peace. Amen

Family Activity: During the month of November display photos of deceased family members and/or write their names on a candle and set up a family altar and pray for each person by name each day. Don't forget to pray for people who may have been forgotten or have no one to pray for them.

Due to COVID19 restrictions the Book of Remembrance is not available this year. Stay tuned!

Tap & Go Machines in our Churches - From this weekend Tap & Go machines will be placed in each of our churches. They will be located at the back of the Churches (not in the foyers). Each payment made through Tap & Go is split between 1st Collection (Clergy) and 2nd Collection (Parish). This cannot be used for Planned Giving contributions. To use:

- Use your credit card
- Tap the machine
- One payment for Parish & Clergy
- A fixed amount is deducted (currently \$10) with each Tap
- Tap multiple times till reaching the amount you wish to donate
- 30% of your payment will go to Clergy (1st Collection) and 70% to Parish (2nd Collection)
