Saint Ignatius Loyola

Ignatius was born in 1491 in the Basque province of northern Spain, the youngest of thirteen children. Aged sixteen, he left home to serve as a page for the Treasurer of Castile in whose service he was often at court where he developed a taste for the material world. He became an officer in the Spanish army but was wounded at Pamplona, suffering a broken leg. Bedridden for twelve months, Ignatius asked for books on chivalry. There were none available so Ignatius was forced to read about the life of Christ and the saints; surprisingly, he found this literature unexpectedly riveting and his heroes became Francis of Assisi and Catherine of Siena.

His reading led Ignatius to realise that God was working within him so in 1522, having decided to serve God, he visited the shrine of Our Lady of Montserrat where he spent much time in prayer. He was determined to follow the call of God and his first step was to relinquish his sword, thus indicating he was no longer a soldier. This was followed by laying aside his fine clothes to which he held a great attachment. He gave the clothes to a poor man, dressing himself from then on in the rough garments and sandals suited to one who was considered poor.

This very different Ignatius visited a cave outside Manresa where he stayed for some time and began writing The Spiritual Exercises. Continuing his life of prayer, he felt called to the priesthood but since he lacked the necessary education, Ignatius went back to school with young children as classmates and later went to the university of Paris where he introduced The Spiritual Exercises to his fellow students. He boarded with two men who would become his close followers and future saints: Francis Xavier and Peter Faber. Ignatius now founded the Society of Jesus and said his first Mass in 1538.

By 1540 there were seven Jesuits and Pope Paul 3rd declared the Society of Jesus a religious order with Ignatius as Father General. The Jesuits took the three vows of poverty, chastity and obedience and a fourth vow of obedience to the Pope.

Ignatius died in 1556 and was beatified in 1609 by Pope Paul 5^{th.} In 1622 he was canonized by Pope Gregory 15th. His feast is 31 July.

Today the Jesuits number more that sixteen thousand members and Pope Francis is the first Jesuit to become Pope. (Liturgy Committee)

Reflection on 'Being On Earth the Heart of God'

Last Thursday evening, 22 July, about 12 parishioners gathered at the Orana Centre in Aranda to participate in a session on Heart Spirituality, led by Cheryl Hamill, who is Assistant Principal - Mission at Daramalan College, and a member of our Parish Pastoral Council.

Cheryl gently shared her knowledge of the story of Heart Spirituality, as lived by the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart (MSC) Order and many lay people around the world.

Cheryl described how this spirituality enables people to live the Gospel with a focus on the heart of Jesus, who reveals God's love for all creation through his words and actions, his compassion and justice, hospitality and forgiveness. We were encouraged to open our hearts to Jesus.

The evening included times for words and shared reflections, prayer and silence.

Sometimes it is a challenge to find ways to nurture our faith. This was one such occasion, and all people present expressed their thanks to Cheryl for sharing her understanding and experience of living Heart Spirituality.

Parish Finance Council Update

At its July meeting the Parish Finance Council discussed the year to date financial position and outlook. The good news is that the Parish's income has been holding up reasonably well and a number of projects have been successfully progressed including long overdue maintenance at the Presbytery to ensure it is in the same condition that we would like in our own homes.

This and other activities undertaken in the Parish would not be possible without the generous financial support of parishioners (via the first collection, Planned giving and special collections) and the invaluable assistance of those who so kindly volunteer their time and expertise. A sincere thank you to all those contributing. The Planned giving program remains the cornerstone of our financial planning as it enables the Finance Council to budget for the current and future years. Contributions via direct debit or credit card are particularly important representing about 78% of pledges for the last 12 months but over 83% of the amount actually received. While all contributors to Planned giving are greatly appreciated, moving to direct debit or credit card from envelopes or cash on the plate provides greater certainty and minimises the risks of handling and storing cash. 
