Child Protection Week: 5-12 September 2021

'Truly children are a gift from the Lord, a blessing, the fruit of the womb' Psalm 127

The theme for Child Protection Week this year is: **Every child in every community needs a fair go.** 

We are asked as a Parish Community to think about all children; not just our own, not just the ones in our Catholic schools, but all children. How can we ensure they all have what they need in life to be happy, healthy, safe, and to have opportunities for good lives?

While the term 'child protection' mostly refers to keeping children safe and free from harm, abuse, or neglect, it also means creating the conditions to help children thrive.

If children are living in situations where they cannot thrive, they need stable, supportive relationships with caring adults to help them through the tough times.

So we are all potentially important people in the lives of children.

And as a faith community, we have a particular responsibility to protect all children and do what we can to give them a fair go.

At the end of Child Protection Week, on Sunday 12 September, the Catholic Church in Australia will mark Safeguarding Sunday. There will be more information about this in next week's bulletin.

If you are concerned about the safety or wellbeing of a child, in terms of physical or emotional abuse or neglect, you should contact ACT Child and Youth Protection Services on 1300 556 729. If your concern relates to child sexual abuse, you must report it to the Police.

If your concern is about the safety or wellbeing of a child as a result of actions by an employee, volunteer or official of the Church, you can also contact the Archdiocesan Institute of Professional Standards and Safety on 6239 9806 or ipss@cg.org.au.

### Week I



**SEASON OF** The Pope has invited all Catholics to take part with other Christians in celebrating the Season of Creation: "This is the season for letting our prayer be inspired anew by closeness to nature."

For Pope Francis, care for creation is a key element of his personal ministry. This is explained in his major encyclical **Laudato Si – On Care for Our Common Home**. But in introduction to the teachings there, the Pope reminds us that earlier Popes, other Christian leaders and scientists had long warned of the damage and the need for greater respect to our environment.

The Pope sees there is now an urgent challenge for humanity to look after the earth, the poor, and the next generation. He calls for a new dialogue, for stronger responses and leadership: "Young people demand change. They wonder how anyone can claim to be building a better future without thinking of the environmental crisis and the sufferings of the excluded."

The Vatican is asking us to use the current 6th anniversary jubilee of *Laudato Si* to grow our understanding of the challenge, most critically in impacts on our climate, on biodiversity, on water supply and on pollution. The Pope notes that since "the deterioration of the environment and of society affects the most vulnerable people" there is an "inseparable … bond between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace."

Throughout the Season of Creation our bulletin will look at how **Laudato Si** provides a theology of environmental responsibility - a coherent approach to creation, God's plan and humankind's place in the plan.

# Canber Effective from 5pm Thursday 2 September to Midnight Friday 17 September 2021 ACT Parishes Only


- 1. Parish Offices are closed to parishioners.
- 2. **Funerals** for 20 people only, not including ministers.
- 3. Weddings for 10 people only, not including the celebrant.
- 4. 'Other <u>religious ceremonies</u> which are *time critical* are permitted' no more than 10 people, not including ministers.
- 5. Holy Communion can be taken to the sick.
- 6. Anointing of the Sick <u>can</u> be celebrated.
- 7. Sacrament of Reconciliation can be celebrated.
- 8. Visitation to hospitals by priests should be minimal (rely on designated hospital chaplains where possible).
- 9. Face Masks are mandatory.
- 10. Check In CBR is mandatory.
- 11. Covid-19 Plan is mandatory.
