Safeguarding Sunday - 12 September 2021

This weekend, our Parish, and in fact the whole Catholic Church in Australia, marks Safeguarding Sunday, when we pray for those who have been abused, their families and supporters.

This Sunday comes at the end of Child Protection Week. While the main focus of the week has been on children, today our thoughts widen to include others who are, or have been, at risk.

As the recent Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety, and the ongoing Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with Disability, show us, there are many people within our community who are vulnerable and may be at risk of abuse. We need to be mindful of <u>all</u> vulnerable people, whatever their age and circumstances.

In particular, as a Church community, we recognise and apologise for the harm done by priests, religious and lay people in Church settings. This has had, and still has, an enormous impact on our Catholic communities, and we continue to seek justice and healing for those who have been harmed.

Our Parish recommits to practices that support survivors and their families, and that make the Catholic Church and its ministries the safest possible place for children and all vulnerable people.

I September to 4 October (Week 2)

In "The gospel of Creation", the second chapter of **Laudato Si**, Pope Francis calls us to accept the "tremendous responsibility" (90) we all have as caretakers of creation. Referring to both the Old and New Testaments, the pope explains that there are



three theological imperatives that are significant for us to understand in relation to our role in the care of our common home:

- All creatures and aspects of creation have an intrinsic value. God has called all things into being for a purpose which is known only to God.
- The gift of creation is a continuing revelation of God that "God is reflected in all that exists." (87). "The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God." (84) This gift was meant for us all, to be cared for by all.
- All creation is connected, "linked by unseen bonds...a sublime communion which fills us with a sacred,
 affectionate and humble respect." (89). Ideally, we should aim to be in proper or right relationship with all
 humans, all of creation and God.

"The ultimate destiny of the universe is in the fullness of God...The ultimate purpose of other creatures is not to be found in us. Rather, all creatures are moving forward with us and through us towards a common point of arrival, which is God, in that transcendent fullness where the risen Christ embraces and illumines all things. Human beings, endowed with intelligence and love, and drawn by the fullness of Christ, are called to lead all creatures back to their Creator. "(83)

Pope Francis concludes this chapter by reminding us of the many examples "in the New Testament that not only tell us of the earthly Jesus and his tangible and loving relationships with the world. It also shows him risen and

The three leaders say: 'We call on everyone, whatever their belief or worldview, to endeavour to listen to the cry of the earth and of people who are poor, examining their behaviour and pledging meaningful sacrifices for the sake of the earth which God has given us.'

The joint declaration strikes a clear warning - 'Today, we are paying the price...Tomorrow could be worse' and concludes that: 'This is a critical moment. Our children's future and the future of our common home depend on it.'
