St Pius of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio) Feast Day 23 September

St. Pio of Pietrelcina was born Francesco Forgione on the 25th May, 1887. At the age of sixteen, he joined the Capuchin friars and was given the name Pius. Seven years later, became a priest. The next fifty years were spent at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo where he was much sought after as a spiritual adviser, confessor and intercessor.



Many miracles were popularly ascribed to him during his lifetime.

He died on the 23rd September, 1968, which was a few days after the fiftieth anniversary of his receiving the stigmata. Over 100,00 attended his funeral.

Padre Pio is the patron saint for stress relief and of civil defence volunteers and adolescents.

(Liturgy Committee)

The **Liturgy Committee** discussed the usage of the AV system in our parish churches for Sunday Masses at its recent meeting and a wish for uniform useage for each of the Masses (not including hymn selection).

The Committee has recommended not to project the words of many of the prayers that are easily committed to memory eg the Lord's Prayer, Lamb of God etc. The weekly bulletin will continue to be published with the Antiphons, Responsorial Psalm etc that are prayed by the assembly and Mass cards and Mass books are available for those who wish to read the remaining prayers.

Guiding the discussion was the purpose and place of screen usage during liturgical celebrations. Of particular concern was that when the assembly focuses its attention on a screen during worship, the dynamic of the ritual is altered: liturgical responses are directed to a screen rather than to the presider or fellow worshippers. For some this is also a distraction to their prayer and flow of the liturgy. Thus, the words and reading become the focus instead of engagement with the sights, sounds, silences and feel of the liturgy.

Parish News

I September to 4 October (Week 3)

In the third chapter of *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis looks at our current ecological crisis in the light of two root causes.



- Technocratic world view While acknowledging the great benefits that technology and science have brought to the world over the last 200 years, the pope warns that to rely solely on technology to solve all our complex problems is risky in that it gives "those with the knowledge, and especially the economic resources to use them, an impressive dominance over the whole of humanity and the entire world." (104). Human being have not always used power well and this technological growth has not been "accompanied by a development in human responsibility, values and conscience" (105). In other words, technology and its use should be seen within an ethical framework and a holistic and spiritual vision of life "a technology severed from ethics will not easily be able to limit its own power."(136)
- Anthropocentrism Human beings have become increasingly self-centred in that they see the world and its creatures and even other humans as objects to be exploited for their own advantage. This has resulted in "use and throw away" reasoning that results in many forms of domination. "Neglecting to monitor the harm done to nature and the environmental impact of our decisions is only the most striking sign of a disregard for the message contained in the structures of nature itself. When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the worth of [every human life] ...it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself; everything is connected." (117)

For Pope Francis, pollution and over-consumption are not the problem in themselves, they are symptoms of a far more serious disconnect in the values of society where we have failed to have an **integrative** world view.

ACT Parishes Only

- 1. Parish Offices are closed to parishioners.
- 2. No in person gatherings permitted (e.g., PPC, PFC, Sacramental Preparation, Alpha & Marriage Courses, Bible Study Groups, RCIA, etc.). *However*,
 - a. *Funerals* for 20 people only, not including ministers.
 - b. Weddings for 10 people only, not including the celebrant.
 - c. 'Other <u>religious ceremonies</u> which are *time critical* are permitted' no more than 10 people, not including ministers. These should not be advertised.

(Live Streaming permitted, but <u>only</u> with celebrant, camera operator & translator)

- 3. Holy Communion <u>can</u> be taken to the sick.
- 4. Anointing of the Sick <u>can</u> be celebrated.
- 5. Sacrament of Reconciliation <u>can</u> be celebrated.
- 6. Visitation to hospitals by priests should be minimal (rely on designated hospital chaplains where possible).
- 7. Face Masks are mandatory.
- 8. Check In CBR is mandatory.
- 9. Covid-19 Plan is mandatory.
