Pope Francis in *Laudato Si* teaches that our faith conviction should motivate us as Christians to

assume our responsibility as caretakers of creation. This is "an essential part" of our faith in the love and wisdom of the Creator, our God who sustains all of creation.

He says biblical narratives on creation indicate "that human life is grounded in three fundamental and closely intertwined relationships: with God, with our neighbour, and with earth itself" [66]. Human brokenness can lead us not to acknowledge our creaturely limitations in asserting power and dominion in creation, but to presume to take the place of God. This disrupts harmony between the creator, humanity and creation. Our calling as people of faith is to be the kind of people who will not only till, but also "keep" the earth - and not let it be despoiled and people forgotten.

In Chapters 5 and 6, Pope Francis outlines concrete steps and opportunities for dialogue which "can help us escape the spiral of self-destruction" [163]. Change is required at personal, community, national and global levels.

Parish News



St Matthew, patron saint of bankers, accountants, bookkeepers and stockbrokers. Feast Day is celebrated on 21 September.

Matthew was born in Palestine sometime in the 1st Century and was the son of Alphaeus. He worked as a Galilean tax collector in Capernaum, and as such would be considered an odd convert to being a follower of Jesus. Matthew would have been considered to be among the "sinners" due to the unfair practices conducted by tax collectors under Roman rule. Additionally, he would have been hated by the Jews as tax collectors were not scrupulous about what they 'skimmed off the top' for themselves. However, he was the first to be invited by Jesus to become one of Jesus' 12 Apostles. After this Jesus was invited by Matthew to a feast,



where Jesus was criticised by Scribes and Pharisees, prompting him to explain that he was there for the sinners and not the righteous. "I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance" (Matthew 9:12)

After Jesus' ascension to heaven, the apostles began their mission of going out to all the world to tell the Good News of Jesus Christ. It is believed that Matthew stayed within the area of Palestine when he first began preaching. It is not recorded historically but has been suggested that he travelled to Ethiopia to continue his mission, it has also been suggested Matthew went to Parthia and Persia. Matthew was also one of the four Evangelists, and authored the first Gospel of the New Testament sometime between 41-50 AD. He wrote his book in Aramaic in the hope that his account would convince his fellow people that Jesus was the Messiah and that His kingdom had been fulfilled in a spiritual way.

Some suppose Matthew was martyred, his tomb is located in the crypt of Salerno Cathedral in southern Italy. He most likely founded several churches. St Matthew was canonised in the 13th Century, one of the first to be canonised just after the process was founded by Pope Gregory IX.



St Vincent de Paul, patron saint of charities, horses, hospitals, leprosy, prisoners, volunteers. Feast day is celebrated on 27 September.

Vincent de Paul was born to a poor peasant family in the French village of Pouy on 24 April 1581. His first formal education was provided by the Franciscans. He did so well he was hired to tutor the children of a nearby wealthy family. He used the monies he earned teaching to continue his formal studies at the University of Toulose where he studied theology.

Vincent was ordained in 1600 and remained in Toulose for a time. In 1605, while on a ship travelling from Marseilles to Narbone, he was captured, brought to

Tunis and sold as a slave. Two years later he and his master managed to escape, and both returned to France.

St. Vincent then went to Avignon and later to Rome to continue his studies. While there he became a chaplain to the Count of Goigny and was placed in charge of distributing money to the deserving poor. He became pastor of a small parish in Clichy for a short period of time, while also serving as a tutor and spiritual director.

From that point forward Vincent spent his life preaching missions, and providing relief, to the poor. He established hospitals for them. This work became Vincent's passion. He later extended his ministry to prisoners. The need to evangelise and assist them was so great; and as the demands were beyond his own ability, Vincent founded the Ladies of Charity, a lay institute of women, to help. He also founded a religious institute of priests - the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, commonly referred to now as the Vincentians. Vincent helped reform the way in which men were instructed and prepared for the priesthood. He did this first through the presentation of retreats and later by helping develop a precursor to our present day seminaries.

St Vincent de Paul is sometimes referred to as "The Apostle of Charity" and "The Father of the Poor." He was canonised in 1737 by Pope Clement XIII, in recognition of his charity and his reform of the clergy. (*Liturgy Committee*)

As a first step you are invited to **watch one or both** of the following films over the next two weeks:

- Before the Flood. This is freely available on Youtube. It is narrated by Leonardo Di Caprio in his role as UN Ambassador for Peace. He interviews scientific and political leaders as well as local people in places like Kiribati, Palau and India. He also has an audience with Pope Francis. <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?</u>
- **Breaking Boundaries: The Science of our Planet**. This is available on Netflix. It is narrated by David Attenborough with a focus on Earth's systems and how humans are pushing them to their limits.

The second step is to join a zoom meeting for all parishioners on **Thursday 14 October at 7.30pm**. In this meeting we will gather for conversation in small groups to share our experience and response to the film/s. Further details will be provided in next week's Parish Bulletin.
