St Therese of the Child Jesus (1873-1899) I October

Generations of Catholics have admired this young saint, called her the "Little Flower", and found in her short life, more inspiration for their own lives than in volumes by theologians. But within 28 years of her death, she was canonised.

As a child, Therese would think about God, life and eternity. At a young age, she tried to join the Carmelite convent but was refused entry. Accordingly, she went to the bishop who declined her entry, so she sought an audience with the Pope. The Vicar General intervened

and soon Therese was admitted to the Carmelite convent that her sisters Pauline and Marie had already joined.

This began a time of suffering when she experienced dryness in prayer when she said "Jesus isn't doing much to keep the conversation going." At times, she would fall asleep in prayer but would console herself by saying that mothers loved children when they lie asleep in their arms so that God must love her when she slept during prayer.

She knew as a Carmelite nun she would never be able to perform great deeds so she took every chance to sacrifice, no matter how small it would seem. She would say that the only way she could prove her love is by scattering flowers that represent every little sacrifice, every glance and word she did for love. When Pauline was elected prioress, because of convent politics, she asked Therese to remain a novice. This meant she would never be a fully professed nun and that she would always have to ask permission for everything she did.

St Therese shows us how to be a person not separated from the love of Jesus. She shows us how to be a witness and follow Jesus with her whole life that was for the glory of God's name. We could do well to ask ourselves are we willing to live lives that are only for the glory of God's name?

October 4 is the feast day of **St Francis of Assisi** (1181-1226). St Francis, "the little poor man", is arguably one of the most renowned of the saints. A saint for our time, he is much-loved by Christians and non-Christians alike. The son of a wealthy Italian cloth merchant, Francis went to war, was captured and held prisoner, became seriously ill and eventually experienced a gradual conversion that led him to renounce worldly goods and embrace a life of poverty. He dedicated his life to imitating the life of Christ, spreading the gospel and serving the poor and outcasts. He founded the mendicant order of Franciscans and, with St Clare, the Poor Clares. He later established a third order for the laity. Prayer, particularly contemplative prayer, was an important part of his life and he had a great love and veneration of the Eucharist. He considered all of creation as a mirror of God and

referred to animals as "brothers" and "sisters". In the *Canticle of the Creatures* he praises and thanks God for all creation including "Sister Moon", "Brother Sun", "Sister Water" and "Brother Fire". Francis remained a layman throughout his life. He was canonised 2 years after his death. Pope John Paul II wrote that St Francis "offers Christians an example of genuine and deep respect for the integrity of creation..." and in 1979 declared him the patron saint of ecology. Pope Francis has described him as a "man of peace, a man of poverty, a man who loved and protected creation". *(Liturgy Committee)*
