Liturgy Line

Last weekend, those who attended the Vigil Mass in person, or on Zoom, were greeted by red vestments. Red is the colour of celebrating Christ's passion. It is also the colour of celebrations of the Holy Spirit. The Vigil Mass last weekend was a Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit. At times, when a significant occasion



arises, a Votive Mass is used. The particular reason last weekend was to ask the Holy Spirit to be with all the Church (yes, that means us too!) as the Synod opened. We also had a brief ritual of the word of God. It was to acknowledge how the word of God has a prominent place in our minds, our hearts, our hands and our feet, as the Holy Spirit speaks to us in these Synod days. It is calling us to listen to our times and listen to them as we listen to God's word. We do this each time we are at Mass. The Holy Spirit, who inspired the writing of the Scriptures, inspires the person proclaiming the word and us hearing it too. Questions arise in us: "What is the word saying to us about service of God and others? To our families? To our culture?"

As per the ACT's COVID 19 Pathway Forward, from **Friday 29 October** restrictions will ease again and we will be allowed a **maximum of 100 people** in our Churches.

October is Mental Health Month across Australia, including in the ACT.

Especially during these times of the COVID pandemic, we can all experience feelings of anxiety, uncertainty, low mood or depression, and grief. Everyone has felt the impact of enormous changes in our lives, even if the changes have been imposed for good reasons.

We need to actively look after ourselves, including our mental wellbeing, so we emerge from this time feeling able to continue with our lives.

There are some things we can do to help ourselves, such as:

- Celebrate the positive in our lives, the strengths that have helped us through challenging times before
- Connect with others, pay attention to our close relationships, keep in touch, reach out and make new friends
- Grow by expanding our horizons and try something new that creates meaning and purpose for ourselves, such as a new hobby
- Be as active as possible. Having a sense of belonging and committing to a purpose in life all contribute to happiness and good mental health.

If you feel like you are just not coping well, or are unable to do the things you usually enjoy doing, then it's best to have a chat with your doctor, who can offer some helpful advice, and refer you to appropriate support if needed.

A new prayer reflection resource FOR INDIVIDUALS & GROUPS Dear Parish Priest and Parish Leaders, We've developed a new 28-day reflection resource called "New Life in Christ". It's the first in a series of flexible resources for the coming liturgical year. New Life in Christ can be used as an Advent resource by individuals and groups, but it has been deliberately written to be used any time during the 2021-2022 liturgical year. Written for busy individuals but easily adapted for groups, each day will include a scripture reading and a reflection upon it, as well as some relevant remarks from Pope Francis and the Congregation for the Clergy. So often we discover that individuals and groups would like to access these resources outside of the liturgical season for which they were written, but feel constrained by the resource theme. New Life in Christ has been written in response to this need. Use it once, use it again, and recommend it to others who would like to use it later. It is entirely flexible and up to you. Beneficially, New Life in Christ has been written by a single author. This allows for continuity and development within the resource, taking the reader on a meaningful journey. The author of New Life in Christ, Shane Dwyer, is an experienced author, speaker, retreat leader and spiritual director. His recent faith formation resources include: Look to Jesus (a 2021 Lenten program), More with Jesus (a resource for those wanting to know more about their baptism), and the Going Deeper online adult formation experience (www.goingdeeper.org.au). At the beginning of every liturgical year, we experience the mercy of God incarnate. That God so loves each of us that he is prepared to become one of us, and in so doing revealing the depth and breadth of his love and mercy, deserves our sustained reflection and prayer. This resource will offer the daily opportunity to do just that. Pre-order now! Delivery expected early November.
