This week we celebrate All Saints and All Souls' Day.

Pastoral Notes for All Souls' Day:

November is a special time to pray for the dead. A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead, once only by visiting a church on 2 November and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. Three conditions are required for gaining the indulgence: sacramental confession, eucharistic communion, and prayer for the pope's intentions. (Norms 15,7). (Ordo 2021)





A new prayer reflection resource

FOR INDIVIDUALS & GROUPS

Dear Parish Priest and Parish Leaders,

We've developed a new 28-day reflection resource called "New Life in Christ". It's the first in a series of flexible resources for the coming liturgical year.

New Life in Christ can be used as an Advent resource by individuals and groups, but it has been deliberately written to be used any time during the 2021-2022 liturgical year.

Written for busy individuals but easily adapted for groups, each day will include a scripture reading and a reflection upon it, as well as some relevant remarks from Pope Francis and the Congregation for the Clergy.

So often we discover that individuals and groups would like to access these resources outside of the liturgical season for which they were written, but feel constrained by the resource theme. New Life in Christ has been written in response to this need. Use it once, use it again, and recommend it to others who would like to use it later. It is entirely flexible and up to you.

Beneficially, New Life in Christ has been written by a single author. This allows for continuity and development within the resource, taking the reader on a meaningful journey. The author of New Life in Christ, Shane Dwyer, is an experienced author, speaker, retreat leader and spiritual director. His recent faith formation resources include: Look to Jesus (a 2021 Lenten program), More with Jesus (a resource for those wanting to know more about their baptism), and the Going Deeper online adult formation experience (www.goingdeeper.org.au).

At the beginning of every liturgical year, we experience the mercy of God incarnate. That God so loves each of us that he is prepared to become one of us, and in so doing revealing the depth and breadth of his love and mercy, deserves our sustained reflection and prayer. This resource will offer the daily opportunity to do just that.
