## Liturgy Line *World Day of Prayer Friday, 4th March*


### I Know the Plans I Have for You

This is the theme for this year's World Day of Prayer which is held on Friday 4 March. **World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement led by Christian women who welcome all to join in prayer and action for peace and justice.**

The theme stems from Jeremiah's letter (29: 1-14) to the exiles who found themselves under imperial rule a long way from home. It reflects a traumatised community who has lost everything: their loved ones, their homes, their beloved city Jerusalem, their language and culture in addition to the familiar expressions of their religion connected to the temple that had been destroyed. The letter encourages the exiles to pick up the pieces and make the most of their lives, and from this emerges a powerful testimony to resilience and survival.

Many of us today may encounter situations that cannot be changed, no matter how much we would have wanted things to be different. The last two pandemic years is one example. The question then is how, amidst such difficult circumstances, can we live the best possible life, including daily practices that make life both possible and meaningful. Perhaps even more important than figuring out how to live amidst these less-than-perfect circumstances is the question of how we manage to find joy while being in 'exile'. The words of the theme convey promise and hope, and are an invitation to place our trust in God at all times.

God of hope, peace and promise  
How often have we found ourselves in exile, separated from your presence!  
Restore us, and let us find you when we seek you.  
Amen.

- Check in CBR is no longer required whilst in our churches.

## The Labyrinth at St. Matthew's.

Sometimes I think this is one of the best kept secrets we parishioners of South Belconnen have.

To the left of St. Matthew's church, behind Marian Hall, the circuits of the Labyrinth invite us to a walking meditation. Labyrinths were common in Europe in the Middle Ages. Walking them was part of religious and popular culture. The circle, a perfect form, can be seen to symbolise eternity, the seasons, the cosmos, God's masterpiece.



There is a single path to the centre and out again – the longest possible way to arrive at the centre. It is important to walk mindfully and not to hurry the experience. In recent months I have met a parishioner who had forgotten it was there; a devotee of labyrinths who came looking for it; a Belconnen resident who told me it appears on the world listing of labyrinths and a former parishioner who has returned after years interstate and didn't know of its existence. The school children walk it during term-time. Regulars use it during the week-ends. Some use the seats for quiet contemplation.

The Labyrinth was constructed after several years of planning and research. It was a response to a resolution from the Parish Assembly which called for "more prayer". Recently two plaques were commissioned; one on the wall giving its rationale and one on the commemorative rock which details the various Paths.

The Labyrinth was blessed and opened in February, 2012, the first Sunday of Lent that year.

Perhaps you too may find it an ideal devotion to mark this year's Lenten observance and beyond.
