DIFFERENT BUT A SHARED FAITH

Saints Peter and Paul, whose solemnity we celebrate today, reflect the response of the Church to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. It is a response of conviction, courage and resilience. Peter was called while a fisherman, Paul while a persecutor of the early Church. God always calls where we are. In today's Gospel Peter makes the profession of faith that Jesus is not only the Messiah or anointed of God but also the son of the living God. This profession of faith is the 'rock' on which the Church will be built. Peter is also given power to bind and loose on behalf of the Church. In this instance and otherwise in the Gospels, Peter, in spite of his later denial of Jesus, clearly has a leadership position amongst the apostles. This is confirmed by the risen Lord when he asks Peter if he loves him. Peter had assumed leadership of the early Jerusalem church with James and John (Acts 10). His preaching put him at odds with the Sanhedrin (the highest authority of the Jews) and the Roman occupiers (who had him imprisoned awaiting trial and possible death). Having miraculously escaped from gaol, as we hear in our First Reading today, he is later In Syrian Antioch (possibly escaping Roman persecution). Later still he was in Rome (I Peter 5:13), where tradition has it that he was executed, being crucified upside down, during the persecution of Nero who ruled from 54-68AD. Peter was referred to as a 'fellow elder' and 'shepherd'; the titles of 'bishop' and II Papa' (Father) from where the title 'Pope' came emerged later. After his Damascus Road experience, Paul became the great missionary disciple to the Gentiles or non-Jews. Paul's three missionary journeys were feats of endurance, all the more so after being shipwrecked several times and being imprisoned, beaten and flogged by both Jews and Roman authorities (cf. our Second Reading today). He was beheaded during the persecution of Nero. Reflecting on his dramatic conversion from privileged Pharisee to ardent Apostle, Paul stated in his Letter to the Ephesians, "I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if I only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts . . . All I want to know is Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his suffering by reproducing the patter of his death. I can assure you my brothers and sisters, I far from thinking that I have already won. All that I say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come" (Eph 3:8-10, 12-13). For Paul and for Peter life is found "in Christ" (the phrase is used over 160 times in letters attributed to St Paul). No human effort, no matter how thorough-going can of itself reconcile us to God. It is only in Christ that sin and division is overcome such that to live fully is to live 'in Christ'.

A THOUGHT ON A DIVIDED WORLD

Both Prime Minister Netanyahu and President Trump subscribe to the proposition, 'Peace through Strength'. On the contrary, as Pope John Paul II insisted, "If you want peace, work for justice, and if you want justice be ready to forgive". History from the Romans onwards has shown that 'Peace through strength' is problematic. It encourages a self-justifying rationale in the build up of arms for the alleged sake of peace. However, it fails to address the underlying injustices that give rise to armed conflict. In fact, it sows the seeds for the next conflict. The nexus must be broken. Only last Saturday, Pope Leo spoke of the need to redress the growing gap between the increasing wealth of a few and the world's poor. "This imbalance generates situations of persistent injustice, which readily lead to violence and, sooner or later, to the tragedy of war", he said, calling for a more equitable distribution of resources (Cath News, 24/6/25) Fr John

Entrance Antiphon

These are the ones who, living in the flesh, planted the Church with their blood; they drank the chalice of the Lord and became the friends of God.

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 12:1-11

King Herod started persecuting certain members of the Church. He beheaded James the brother of John, and when he saw that this pleased the Jews he decided to arrest Peter as well. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread, and he put Peter in prison, assigning four squads of four soldiers each to guard him in turns. Herod meant to try Peter in public after the end of Passover week. All the time Peter was under guard the Church prayed to God for him unremittingly.

On the night before Herod was to try him, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, fastened with double chains, while guards kept watch at the main entrance to the prison. Then suddenly the angel of the Lord stood there, and the cell was filled with light. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him. 'Get up!' he said 'Hurry!' and the chains fell from his hands. The angel then said, 'Put on your belt and sandals.' After he had done this, the angel next said, 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.' Peter followed him, but had no idea that what the angel did was all happening in reality; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed through two guard posts one after the other, and reached the iron gate leading to the city. This opened of its own accord; they went through it and had walked the whole length of one street when suddenly the angel left him. It was only then that Peter came to himself. 'Now I know it is all true,' he said. 'The Lord really did send his angel and has saved me from Herod and from all that the Jewish people were so certain would happen to me.'

The Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
