TO SEE AND TO RESPOND

"Never see a need without doing something about it" is the oftquoted comment of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. No doubt it was inspired in part by today's Gospel of the Good Samari-Scripture scholar Fr Richard Byrne SI notes that without it, tan. "Christianity would be something else. Here we encounter something truly distinctive of the teaching of Jesus." To appreciate the point, we need to understand that for the audience of Jesus a 'Good Samaritan' was a contradiction in terms or an oxymoron. Samaritans were dismissed as bad, never good. Today it would be akin to speaking of a "good terrorist" or a "good drug dealer". It is noteworthy that the priest and Levite had reason to move on; contact with the injured or soon to be dead man would prevent them carrying out their sacred duties. We all have our reasons for avoiding or moving on. In his autobiography 'Hope' (2025), Pope Francis reflects on the destruction of lives through wars, corruption, abuse and exploitation. Speaking with Lilliana Segre who was interned in Auschwitz as a teenager, he quotes her one-word answer as to the reason for the horrors of the Nazis: "Indifference". Pope Francis reflects: "What does it matter to me?" This is Cain's answer to God. "Am I my brother's keeper?" (Gen 4:9). An answer that looks no one in the face: old people, children, mothers, fathers" Reflecting on the notion of 'neighbour', Byrne asks what attitude do I bring to the other? Do I see primarily an ethnic, cultural, social or occupational tag? Or do I go through these surface things and see, first and foremost, and with compassion, a fellow human being?" Byrne continues, "The 'way to eternal life' is to allow oneself to become in this way an active instrument of the boundary-breaking hospitality of God." Dr Geoff Davies, author, commentator and scientist writing in 'Pearls and Irritations' (10 July) maintains that it is difficult to address need without 'seeing' and this is increasingly difficult. "We commonly react with empathy and compassion when others are suffering, even complete strangers, yet we can also be indifferent to suffering or even hostile. Our innate empathy fails in large, citified, civilised societies, for want of direct eye contact . . . If we want to save humanity, we need to save our humanity". Note the convergences of that which science tells us will humanise and the call of faith to see with the eye of divine hospitality. To 'walk together' or the call of Popes Francis and Leo to 'synodality' is to see the other anew and both move forward enriched. The opposite is estrangement and indifference. We are called to be 'Good Samaritans'. Fr John



LITURGY OF THE WORD

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time C

Entrance Antiphon

As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

First Reading Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses said to the people: 'Obey the voice of the Lord your God, keeping those commandments and laws of his that are written in the Book of this Law, and you shall return to the Lord your God with all your heart and soul.

'For this Law that I enjoin on you today is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach. It is not in heaven, so that you need to wonder, "Who will go up to heaven for us and bring it down to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" Nor is it beyond the seas, so that you need to wonder, "Who will cross the seas for us and bring it back to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" No, the Word is very near to you, it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance.'

Second Reading Colossians 1:15-20

Christ Jesus is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation, for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignties, Powers – all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. As he is the Beginning, he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God wanted all perfection

to be found in him

and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace

by his death on the cross.

Gospel Luke 10:25-37

There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, 'Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? What do you read there?' He replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' 'You have answered right,' said Jesus, 'do this and life is yours.'

But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to lesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said, "and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have." Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigands' hands?' 'The one who took pity on him,' he replied. Jesus said to him, 'Go and do the same yourself.'
