TO BE GROUNED OR HUMBLE IN FAITH

'Humility' is the focus of our Gospel today. However, the focus is not just humility in everyday life but humility in acceptance of the invitation to new life in Christ. Jesus is speaking to an audience that is honour and shame based. In the parable of the wedding guest having to move to a lower place, the loss of face and humiliation in that society would be sorely felt. "The sense of horror that even the thought of such an experience conjures up gives bite to the situation the parable actually refers to: the great reversal that is to come at the end of time. If everything is going to be reversed when the Kingdom of God is established (see the Magnificat [Luke 1:51-53]; the Beatitudes and Woes [Luke 6:20-26]), those who choose now to sit with the poor and lowly are destined for promotion, while those who sit now with the rich and powerful will find themselves ordered down to the lowest places. So the point is made: if in the case of banquets like this present one you would experience such shame at finding yourself demoted before the eyes of all, just think how much more painful it will be to experience that at the end of the age, when all is decided and set forever!" (Brendan Byrne SJ). Today is Social Justice Sunday. The 2025 Australian Catholic Bishops Conference's Social Justice Statement, 'Signs of Hope on the Edge' addresses homelessness. Since 1940 Australian Bishops have released a Statement on a key issue in Australian society. Conference President, Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB, says in the foreword to the statement that services are stretched and under-resourced, making it harder to provide adequate support for those who need it. An estimated 280,000 people access homelessness services each year, with one in three having a current mental health issue. Archbishop Costlello encourages "all who are baptised to, instead, offer loving friendship to people on the edge of society. Instead of walking by and not noticing the plight of our neighbours, pay attention to them and their plight, listen to their stories, and serve them with the love we learn from Jesus." Copies of the Statement were forwarded with the online bulletin. For those who did not receive the online bulletin, copies are available in the foyer or at the ACBC website. Very much related to the Social Justice Statement is the annual international August-September 'Season of Creation' inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical 'Laudato Si'. At 2:00pm, Saturday, 13 September in St Matthew's Church our parish Laudato Si group will host the Canberra celebration of 'Via Creationis' (see notice inside bulletin). After the style of the Stations of the Cross, the celebration is a prayerful reflection on the gift of creation, 'our common home'. Both the challenge of homelessness and issues pertaining to our common home are reflected in the following prayer:

Creator of all, we praise you for the gift of life and for the faith that unites us in care for our common home. We confess how estranged we have become — from one another, from your Creation, and from our truest selves. **Prince of Peace**, through your wounds, teach us to stand in solidarity with the woundedness of others, of creation, and of the world. Through your resurrection, make us people of hope — with a vision of swords turned into ploughshares and tears transformed into joy. May we come together as one family, to labor for your peace — a shalom where all your people may dwell in safety, and rest in quiet places. Amen.

Entrance Antiphon

First Reading Sirach 3:17-20, 28-29

My son, be gentle in carrying out your business, and you will be better loved than a lavish giver. The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly,

and then you will find favour with the Lord; for great though the power of the Lord is, he accepts the homage of the humble.

There is no cure for the proud man's malady, since an evil growth has taken root in him.

The heart of a sensible man will reflect on parables, an attentive ear is the sage's dream.

Second Reading Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24

What you have come to is nothing known to the senses: not a blazing fire, or a gloom turning to total darkness, or a storm; or trumpeting thunder or the great voice speaking which made everyone that heard it beg that no more should be said to them. But what you have come to is Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem where the millions of angels have gathered for the festival, with the whole Church in which everyone is a 'first-born son' and a citizen of heaven. You have come to God himself, the supreme Judge,

and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

Gospel Luke 14:1. 7-14

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
