Something to think about.

NAIDOC WEEK, 6-13 JULY

Over 1000 Aboriginal folk gathered in Sydney on 26 January 1938 (150 years after European settlement in Australia) to call for full citizenship and laws to improve the lot of Aboriginal people. Remembered as the first 'Day of Mourning', it morphed in 1975 into what we know as NAIDOC Week (National Aboriginal and Islanders Day Observance Committee), celebrated from the first to the second Sunday of July.

It continues as a time of both protest and celebration of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture. We gather today on the land of the **Ngunnawal people** and pay our respects to their culture and leaders past, present and emerging. The NAIDOC week organisers make the necessary distinction between 'cultural appreciation' (i.e., "appreciating another culture in a respectful, sincere way that helps broaden perspectives and build cross-cultural connections") and 'cultural appropriation' (i.e., "using elements of a culture which you do not belong to [as this is] disrespectful, exploitative, hurtful and reinforces racism"). How might each of us and our parish as a whole further the aspirations of NAIDOC Week? A growth in awareness of pertinent data might stimulate further reflection and action (see foyer sheet prepared by the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council)

Gospel Luke 10:1-12. 17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'
