HOSPITALITY OFFERED, HOSPITALITY RECEIVED

Jesus engaged through the everyday. He revealed 'something more' through sickness, wine, yoked oxen, water, bread, shepherds, racism, fishing, love, taxes, mustard seeds, children, grief, sin, hypocrisy, storms . . . Today's First Reading and Gospel see the imparting of 'something more' or deeper significance in acts of hospitality. And it is not just hospitality offered, it is also hospitality received. In our First Reading the now old Abraham offers hospitality to three strangers, who also present as one. Some Fathers of the Church saw this as foreshadowing what we call the Trinity. Abraham's guests promise that Abraham's aged wife Sarah will have a child. Sarah laughs at the idea (Gen 18:12). In fact, her son's name Isaac, which means 'laughs' or 'smiles' is a pun reflective of her response. As the guests received hospitality, they also give. The promise made to Abraham is that he we will be the father of a great people (Israel) and a blessing for all nations (Gen. 18:18). However, conflating a religious belief (Judaism) and politics (Zionism) is to say the least problematic, as was 'Christendom' (cf. the Inquisition). The separation of church and state to serve the common good is nonetheless also problematic when the call to stamp out 'anti-semitism' does not take account of the fact that Palestinians are Semites too. God's hospitality is extended to all for the good of all. To undermine that for the advantage of a relative few is contrary to the universal hospitality of God fully revealed in Jesus. So too in our Gospel Martha misses the point. She appears to have a legitimate complaint about providing hospitality for Jesus while Mary just sits and listens to him. Martha however fails to understand, as we often do too, "that the Lord's primary intent toward us is to bestow upon us life, love and salvation, rather than to make use of our service" (Brendan Byrne). Do we create the space to receive the hospitality of God? Or do we just presume to get on with it on our terms? I often do. Hence the need for personal and communal prayer to be first renewed in our awareness of God's love. We are called to be transformed in the Lord's image and likeness, not for the Lord to be transformed into ours. The call of a 'synodal' Church is to first listen and then respond to where the Spirit is discerned to be calling. In our Second Reading from Colossians, Paul or possibly a disciple very familiar with his thought, speaks of his ministry "to draw the nations of the world into the riches of salvation previously confined to Israel. There is no part of the human world where the saving power of Christ is not ready to break out" (ibid). Might we be a recipient of God's loving embrace and part of the mission of the Church. Lord, that I might see and respond as you would have it.
