# TO WALK ALONE OR IN FRIENDSHIP

Thank you for your enthusiastic engagement in our Parish Assembly process at all Masses last weekend. Your written responses to the first question about where the Holy Spirit has moved in our parish or more particularly what you value about our parish are available in the foyer. This weekend Phil(omena) Billington will again facilitate our synodal journey. Our question for prayerful consideration and sharing is, "Where is the Holy Spirit calling us?" or "What do you think the Holy Spirit is asking us to introduce to the parish?"

As is so often the case, our Readings today are very apt. They remind us of the need to persevere in the face of opposition sure of final victory in Christ. Unlike the overt opposition faced by the early Church, the opposition we face is indifference and the marginalising of organised religion in the name of an impoverished rationalistic, individualistic and circumscribed worldview. Add to this the inconsistent witness of the Church to what it proclaims and we can understandably buy into cynicism and indifference. Our greatest opposition can come from within. Many have walked. Others remain by habit. Most of Jesus's friends deserted him in his hour of need, but he forgave those who persecuted him and he forgave Peter for denying him. What about us? Is it all worthwhile? Yes, it is. We are called to affirm that we are a body-soul-mind entity formed in community. We draw on both faith and reason to assert that love is the source and end of life and the most noble of human experiences, conquering even death. We find both ultimate meaning and immediate significance in the most mundane events because the One who is totally other has become one-with-us. That changes everything, literally. God seeks friendship with us and through us. Now that is a worldview worth living and, yes, worth dying for. We may not face the threat of martyrdom but like the early Christians we are called to witness in faith, to 'let go', or in church-speak to share in the cross of Christ. To do so is to die to that which demeans in order to truly live. 'Walking together' through conversations in the Spirit we can fashion anew our friendship with God in Jesus and with each other. We can put legs on our call to be 'disciples of hope'. Gifted with the Eucharist - "Do this in memory of me" - we are called to be what we celebrate, the body of Christ in our time and place. Finally, I read the reflections of John Menadue on the 11 November 1975 dismissal of Prime Minister Gough Whitlam. As adviser to Whitlam and later Prime Minister Malcolm Fraser, Menadue speaks with firsthand knowledge ('Pearls and Irritations'). On 11 November we also remembered the fallen, especially our first Anzacs. To remember and to act on what endures in the face of adversity is foundational to healthy politics, community and religion. Lest we forget.

# Second Reading 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

# Gospel <u>Luke 21:5-19</u>

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?"

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name - and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
