IN GIVING WE RECEIVE FAR MORE

The blossom and wattle are out. New life heralds a change of season. How appropriate that we celebrate Father's Day this weekend. Fatherhood bespeaks life and nurture in union with their beloved and with God, the source and end of all life. Fathers and father-figures, living or dead are remembered, honoured and prayed for.

> God our Father, we give thanks and praise for fathers, young and old. We pray for young fathers who are newly embracing their role. May they find courage and perseverance to balance work, family and faith in joy and sacrifice. We pray for fathers around the world whose children are lost and suffering. May they know that the God of compassion walks with them in their sorrow. We pray for men who are not fathers but who still mentor and guide us with fatherly advice. We remember fathers, grandfathers and great grandfathers who are no longer with us, but who continue to live in our memory, having nourished us with their love.

As a father wants the best for their child, so God thirsts for relationship with each of us. However, our ego and pride is reluctant to let go and to follow as trusting disciples. Today's readings are about the cost of discipleship. The choice to be a disciple requires renunciation. "In a sense what Jesus is doing in the Gospel is simply being honest with his disciples. He foresees that those who follow him will inevitably become caught up in the suffering and death he now sees ahead of him. It is no kindness to his followers to keep them in ignorance of this. He must prick any illusions they have about where following him might lead" (Brendan Byrne SJ). Fair enough. Yet being a disciple surely does not require that I "hate" my mother and father? "Semitic languages, by and large, do not have a word for "prefer". . . "Hate", then, is simply and expression of rejecting something (possibly quite good in itself) in favour of something considered more desirable. While it would be wrong to water down the strength of Jesus' prophetic utterance, what he is saying, then, is that family allegiances — so strong in the Palestinian culture of Jesus - have to take second place as far as following him is concerned" (ibid). Jesus illustrates his point with two parables, one about the sense of shame, so strong in Palestinian culture, of a builder unable to complete his project and then the caution of a king up against a vastly superior enemy. Talk about 'buyer beware'! On the other hand, the 'yes' of discipleship in comparison to the supreme good of the Kingdom finds some proportion. In giving we receive far more.

Second Reading Philemon 12-17:Phlm 9-10, 12-17

This is Paul writing, an old man now and, what is more, still a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for a child of mine, whose father I became while wearing these chains: I

mean Onesimus. I am sending him back to you, and with him – I could say – a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

Gospel Luke 14:25-33

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'
