#### THE CRUIFORM PATTERN OF LIFE

Today's feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross invites us to see the life, death and resurrection of Jesus anew. Most Christians subscribe to 'atonement theology': on the cross Jesus paid the price or ransom to our aggrieved Father for our salvation. This understanding paints the Father in a rather cruel manner with Jesus being seen as the 'scapegoat' who takes our sins away. Early Christians were conflicted about venerating the cross as it was means of terrible execution. This changed when Emperor Constantine (306-337AD) became Christian and abolished crucifixion. The way was clear for veneration of the cross. This was anticipated in today's Gospel from John, the fourth and last Gospel. Jesus being lifted up on the cross is seen as his 'glorification' and beginning of his return to the Father. A development of this is seen in the Franciscan theology of St Bonaventure and Duns Scotus. Rather than paying a price as such, the understanding is that Jesus enters in or identifies with all the suffering of the world and is transformed by it as is evidenced by his resurrection. Fr Richard Rohr OFM (with my highlights and one comment) explains: "The Divine Mind transforms all human suffering by identifying completely with the human predicament and standing in full solidarity with it from beginning to end. . . The cross is not just a singular event. It's a statement from God that reality has a cruciform pattern. Jesus was killed in a collision of cross-purposes, conflicting interests, and half-truths, caught between the demands of an empire and the religious establishment of his day. The cross was the price lesus paid for living in a "mixed" world, which is both human and divine, simultaneously broken and utterly whole. He hung between a good thief and a bad thief, between heaven and earth, inside of both humanity and divinity, a male body with a feminine soul, utterly whole and yet utterly disfiguredholding together all the primary opposites (see Colossians 1:15-20).

... Reality, we know, is always filled with contradictions, what St. Bonaventure and others . . . called the "coincidence of opposites." This is what we all resist and oppose much of our life.

Jesus the Christ, in his crucifixion and resurrection, "recapitulated all things in himself, everything in heaven and everything on earth" (Ephesians 1:10). This one verse is the summary of Franciscan Christology. Jesus agreed to carry the mystery of universal suffering. He allowed it to change him ("Resurrection") and us, too, so that we would be freed from the endless cycle of projecting our pain elsewhere or remaining trapped inside of it.

... The people who hold the contradictions and resolve them in themselves are the saviors of the world. They are the only real agents of transformation, reconciliation, and newness.

Christians are meant to be the visible compassion of God on earth more than "those who are going to heaven." . . . Some people feel called and agree to not hide from the dark side of things or the rejected group, but in fact draw close to the pain of the world and allow it to radically change their perspective. They agree to embrace the imperfection and even the injustices of our world [and their personal dark side and inconsistencies – Fr John], allowing these situations to change them from the inside out, which is the only way things are changed anyway" (adapted from 'The Universal Christ' (2019), pp. 147-148).

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

## THE EXALTATION of the HOLY CROSS C

#### Entrance Antiphon

We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection,

through whom we are saved and delivered.

## First Reading Numbers 21:4-9

On the way through the wilderness, the Israelites lost patience. They spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt to die in this wilderness? For there is neither bread nor water here; we are sick of this unsatisfying food.'

At this God sent fiery serpents among the people; their bite brought death to many in Israel. The people came and said to Moses, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you. Intercede for us with the Lord to save us from these serpents.' Moses interceded for the people, and the Lord answered him, 'Make a fiery serpent and put it on a standard. If anyone is bitten and looks at it, he shall live.' So Moses fashioned a bronze serpent which he put on a standard, and if anyone was bitten by a serpent, he looked at the bronze serpent and lived.
