Archdiocesan Response

Review of future governance and operations of CatholicCare and Marymead

12 July 2021

The review was undertaken by *KBWest Advisory* for *three reasons:*

- 1. Demographic change, with the population of Canberra expected to be 700,000, with 915,000 living in the Canberra region, by 2050.
- 2. Significant change to the community and social services sector.
- 3. Desire to deepen the evangelising mission of the Church in its care for those in need.

The 39 page review recommends:

- 4. The bringing together of the two agencies, creating one new agency, named *Marymead CatholicCare*.
- 5. The establishment of a new leadership structure.
- 6. The establishment of a new governing structure.

Archbishop Prowse *accepts* these recommendations. Furthermore, the review recommends *three stages of implementation*:

- 7. Stage One: July 2021
- 8. Stage Two: 2021/2022
- 9. Stage Three: 2022

Stage One begins July 2021 with the following:

- 10. Establishment of a new (foundation) governing board, consisting of:
 - a. Two members of the Archdiocesan Chancery.
 - b. Three members of the existing *Marymead* Board.
 - c. The existing CEO of *CatholicCare*.

These members will be appointed by the Archbishop, with the possible addition of no more than three board members based on skill in the future.

- 11. The appointment of Anne Kirwan as Group CEO.
- 12. The appointment of Tracey Hall and Lisa Higginson as Group Deputy CEO's.
- 13. Initial meeting of the foundation board of *Marymead CatholicCare* will take place July 2021.
- 14. *Frontline services* of *Marymead CatholicCare are unaffected*, delivered by *existing staff*, benefiting from shared support services.
