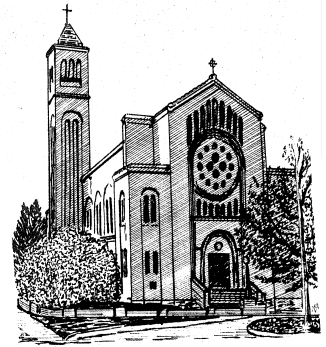

The parable of the Mustard Seed is not what it first seems, nor is the reality it seeks to depict. For years, the parable was always dominated by the interpretation that 'big things have small beginnings.' And while there's truth in this, one can't help but think that perhaps Jesus' intention was to go a little deeper.

Jesus preached the Kingdom that the people had longed for. He had enriched and enlightened them of the truth and purpose of their lives. And now, teaching the crowds, Jesus answers the question they are all asking. "This Kingdom you talk about? What is it like?"

Jesus' response however - in the form of a parable - is not what is expected. The keen ears anticipated hearing something like that from the prophet Ezekiel in our first reading: "The Kingdom of God is like a great Cedar"; the greatest of all the trees, prominent, imposing, and strong. The Cedar was a symbol of the might and power of the coming of God's grand ruling on earth.

Yet instead, foreseeing the misunderstandings of so many (and still many today) about the kind of salvation and the type of kingdom God promises, Jesus responds: "It's more like a mustard seed... [which] grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade." "Sorry... like what!?" They would have quietly mumbled: "Does he know what a mustard seed is?" Poor choice...

Of all the seeds Jesus could have chosen, he opts for not only the smallest, but a seed that doesn't grow into a tree at all. The mustard seed becomes more like canola. Maybe a tall weed, but no strong branches in sight. The seed is not impressive nor imposing... and so *this seemed* it the worst possible comparison for the glorious kingdom.

Yet Jesus is making a powerfully sobering point. Even though we *think* we understand, just as we think we 'get it' - we discover we have no idea! This Kingdom is like nothing we have ever known. Many would have criticised: "the mustard seed doesn't even become a tree! How can it have branches?" To which Jesus responds: "Nor does the kingdom of God become what you think, expect, believe or even want it to be! Who you think it is for, and more importantly, who it is *not* for!"

The parable goes deeper still, the mustard shrub was seen as a noxious weed, disruptive and certainly a hassle! Is that not how many today view the Church, religion, Jesus and even his Kingdom? It tends to take over where it is not wanted, into the smallest cracks and darkest places, and is always triumphant. Just when one thinks it is gone, up pops again... impossible to poison or destroy. This is the Kingdom of God - beyond any conception or explanation of ours.

These words greet us with comfort when we contemplate the body which is the Church. Her roots are deep and healthy, and the kingdom is sprouting in Her, quietly growing, not in *our* image, expectations or even hopes, but in God's, each day. The approaching plenary council itself asks us, how can we participate in this sprouting of God's Kingdom, here and now?

God's kingdom is quietly advancing, on the surface often unnoticed, but its deep roots ready and full of life. "Night and day" we hear "while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear."

Friends, let us never cease to have a childlike, unassuming anticipation for the Kingdom. That we may live lives open to the promises it brings and the seeds it subtly plants within us. That we may honestly pray: "Your Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

### First Reading

**Ez 17:22-24**

The Lord says this: 'From the top of the cedar, from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain. I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel. It will sprout branches and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Every kind of bird will live beneath it, every winged creature rest in the shade of its branches. And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow, who withers green trees and makes the withered green. I, the Lord, have spoken, and I will do it.'

### Second Reading

**2 Cor 5:6-10**

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight – we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

### Gospel Reading

**Mk 4:26-34**

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
