

NEW PROTOCOLS AND CHANGES TO MASS TIMES AND RECONCILIA-TION—See front page for Mass and Reconciliation times for the Cathedral and St Peter Chanel's church, Yarralumla.

- In accordance with government restrictions, only 100 people are permitted in the church at any one time. Entry to the Mass will be through one door.
- All attendees must complete the Mass Register prior to entry.
- Communion in the hand only (not the Precious Blood).
- Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 4sqm p/p rule.
- Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed.
- Please also use the hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your area with the wipes provided.
- No physical contact at the sign of peace.
- No collection plates to be passed around, but money/envelopes placed at collection points.

Thank you for your assistance in keeping everyone safe.

From Archbishop Christopher:

Plenary Council - Some Challenges: Due to COVID-19, the Plenary Council will now take place in Adelaide on October 2021 and Sydney in July 2022. May I offer four challenges and reflections.

- 1. A JOURNEY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Plenary Council is a work of the Holy Spirit. This means we journey together by way of silence, listening and patient discernment. This is the most important foundation we must all share. Already this journey has taken us over two years. We need to assess how we have fared in this challenge. I would say we have much room for improvement.
- 2. CONFUSION OVER THE WORD "GOVERNANCE". The key word "governance" requires greater definition. It has a theological meaning; it is a derivative of our baptism whereby we share in the mission of Christ as Priest (sanctifying), Prophet (teaching) and King (governing). It also has a corporate meaning. Good governance is anchored in administrative processes and protocols alongside essential words like "transparency" and "accountability". The Catholic Church has much to learn from this corporate meaning.
- 3. THE CHANGE IN CATHOLIC DEMOGRAPHICS. The recently deceased and loved member of the Plenary Council Facilitation Team, Columban priest Fr Noel Connolly, wrote: "By 2050, 80 per cent of Catholics (globally) will live in or trace their origins to the Global South. "The typical Christian will soon be a poor coloured woman from a shantytown in Kinshasa, Buenos Aires, Manila or some other large city in the majority world ... "Forty nine per cent of all Australians are born overseas or have a parent born overseas." We are challenged to do more to engage our huge vibrant Catholic migrant and youth communities.
- 4. TO AGREE ON EVANGELISATION AS THE KEY. Surely we all agree evangelisation is the key pastoral paradigm of the Plenary Council. Discernment is still required as to how this paradigm is to engage practically our complex Australian evolving culture and those on the periphery of life, especially our First Australians.

Readings of the Day – 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: The Lord is the strength of his people, a saving refuge for the one he has anointed.

Save your people, Lord, and bless your heritage, and govern them for ever.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Lord, in your great love, answer me.

First Reading Jer 20:10-13

Jeremiah said: 'I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side! Denounce him! Let us denounce him!" All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, "Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge!" But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. But you, Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them, for I have committed my cause to you. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men.'

Second Reading Rom 5:12-15

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

Gospel Reading Mt 10:26-33

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops.

'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'
