WHO IS WORTHY OF JESUS?

It is a bit alien to us to talk about worthiness, culturally it is not something we often think about. I remember at a conference hearing a high school teacher share some of her students' feelings on the new translation of the Mass: "One of my students refuses to say 'Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof' because she thinks it's wrong to say that someone is unworthy of something."

I commend this teacher that her students are actually listening and reflecting upon the words of the mass. I would be surprised if this students reasoning is not common, it certainly does not sound empowering to say we are not worthy. We are conditioned to think in a positive way, and for Jesus to say that someone is not worthy of receiving Him or following Him makes us think He's a snob, or that He (God almighty) is too good for us.

Worth does not always correlate to goodness, and there are objectively things we are not worthy of, let's look at a couple of scenarios and explore this concept:

Asking for membership in an organisation and being refused because you are not considered worthy enough.

Asking for a promotion at work and being refused for not being worthy of it.

Asking for someone's hand in marriage and being refused because you aren't worthy enough.

Asking someone to risk their life on your behalf and they refuse because you aren't worthy of it.

Asking someone if they can take the blame for your actions and they refuse because you aren't worthy of that.

Asking someone if you can eat their body and drink their blood, and being refused for not being worthy of it.

For the first two examples, I think most of us would concede there are qualifications needed for specific groups or roles. When it comes to giving committing your life to another, very few people would say that they are worthy of their spouse, or that they truly deserve the sacrifices of others. No one can ever be so worthy that, someone else takes their punishment, or that someone should


give their life on their behalf.

Yet this is what Jesus does for us, we are all of us unworthy of him. Not a single person could ever say that they deserved Jesus to die for him or her, or that they deserve to eat his flesh and blood. Nevertheless, this is just how generous God is. He does these things despite our unworthiness.

How can we possibly respond to this?

The only possible response is to continually affirm that we are unworthy of his mercy and generosity, to rightly prefer Him above all others, and to try our very best to live a life that is worthy of His sacrifice.

First Reading 2 Kgs 4:8-11. 14-16

'One day as Elisha was on his way to Shunem, a woman of rank who lived there pressed him to stay and eat there. After this he always broke his journey for a meal when he passed that way. She said to her husband, 'Look, I am sure the man who is constantly passing our way must be a holy man of God. Let us build him a small room on the roof, and put him a bed in it, and a table and chair and lamp; whenever he comes to us he can rest there.' One day when he came, he retired to the upper room and lay down. 'What can be done for her?' he asked. Gehazi (his servant) answered, 'Well, she has no son and her husband is old.' Elisha said, 'Call her.' The servant called her and she stood at the door. 'This time next year,' Elisha said 'you will hold a son in your arms.'

Second Reading Rom 6:3-4.8-11

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life. But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Mt 10:37-42

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. 'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me. 'Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man's reward. 'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'
