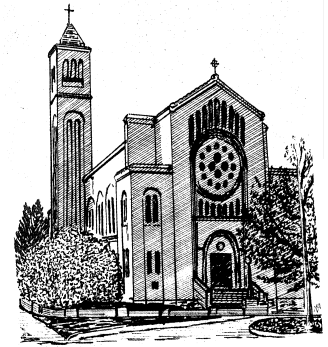

As Jesus sends out his disciples, they are entrusted with the grace and power to witness to his Name. Setting out for the first time, he instructs them to rely only upon him. Imagine their shock as they're told to take none of those things we consider standard (and even prudent) for such a journey. As his beloved disciples, they are to go to the ends of the earth! But what is this discipleship?

In first century Palestine, a devout Jew, after years of study and discipline, might approach the rabbi to be questioned. After examining the student's knowledge of scripture and its interpretation, the rabbi could determine, 'yes!' you have what it takes to become like me' - and so would accept them as a 'disciple'.

Jesus redefines this norm of discipleship, calling not the most learned or proven, but those with ears to hear, and hearts open to responding. In fact, those he calls could only be collectively identified as 'misfits'. John and Andrew had been disciples of John the Baptist, but now they leave to follow Christ. Then there is Peter, who was not even looking for a rabbi! A fisherman, and a reasonably successful one at that, he too hears and follows. And then... Matthew sitting at his tax booth; loathed by his fellow Jews as one working for the oppressive Roman occupation. Jesus looked at them... and said, 'yes, ... you can be like me'.

Often, we think ourselves so different, so distant from the 12; they all have their stain glass windows and relics venerated around the world! Yet, in truth - we are astoundingly alike. This Sunday (and every Sunday) calls us to reflect upon our own discipleship, and what it means.

The call and purpose of the disciple is *to become like the Master*. Having within us what St. Paul called, *the mind of Christ* (Phil 2:5). The disciple is one interiorly conformed to the Father's will - this is the ultimate goal, to be *alter Christus* in the world. To act, to feel, to look like Christ. Yet, our question becomes, how do I know I am moving in this direction, moulded in this image? What makes me a disciple? I was once told four marks, or rather habits of the disciple.

The first and most fundamental is *relationship*. The disciple is one who is *in* a relationship. They know this, and they live accordingly. And we know, that all genuine relationships ask something of us, whereby they have two things: real rights and real responsibilities. As a child of God, you have real rights - real access to the Father through the Son, in the Holy Spirit. But... you also have real responsibilities. I need to live in the way God is calling me to live. This relationship changes and challenges me. I need to grow. The temptation of the world is to follow a Jesus created in its *own* image and likeness, as opposed to the objective person, the second Person of the Trinity, of whom I have a real, intimate, personal, and living relationship with. This too means, I can't expect that such a relationship will be the same in 10, 15, 30 years from now.

Which leads to a second habit - simply *showing up*. When it comes time for us to act, in any relationship, we need to be there. For prayer, for Mass; living a regular prayer life and intimate communion in the Eucharist and reconciliation. And yet being 'present' is not just exterior but *interior*. In any relationship, again you can tell when someone isn't really 'present', when their mind and even worse, their heart is somewhere else! We do this in conversations when our mind and concern is in another place- we are on our phone, we're looking around. The disciple does not do this. For that relationship to grow I need to be present exteriorly (physically) but even more truthfully, interiorly.

Building upon this is the habit of *consistency*, or we might say 'faithfulness' or 'steadfastness'. When I am inconsistent with something, by definition, I am unfaithful to it. The disciple is someone who consistently lives out of the relationship they have through and in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Consistently they 'show up' to prayer, even (or most especially) when prayer is difficult or dry. The relationship does not cease, and nor should the honesty or intimacy. We might occasionally pray intensely and then 'fall away' from prayer for a time, only to return again... but consistency beats intensity every time. Consistency - or fidelity - is what changes our hearts, and what makes disciples. The disciple *literally lives* every moment in the Son - through every storm and every joy. Again, just look at the twelve, it's not even about intensity... only consistency, not being discouraged by our wounds but simply being there with Jesus, as we are. Faithfulness *is* consistency. This is what makes us like Jesus - the goal of discipleship.

Finally, a disciple keeps their commitments - they make decision and accept the commitments that flow from them. Being in a relationship means being less about self, and more about the other, in this case... the Master. The disciple keeps their commitments to others, as well as to God. If I am in a relationship - a covenant relationship none the less - that means I have been given commandments and if I want to be in him, I need to keep them; those commitments; united to him even when I fail. Jesus himself encourages us, "If you love Me, keep My commandments" (John 14:15), and so, "*remain in my love*". (John 15:9).

Friends, Jesus calls the broken and imperfect, and sends us out as more than just 'followers'. He calls and sends us as *disciples*. In the coming week let us renew our discipleship in Christ, strengthened by the knowledge that each and every moment of our lives matters, in the called to become more and more, a faithful disciple and friend of Christ.

First Reading

Am 7:12-15

Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, said to Amos, ‘Go away, seer; get back to the land of Judah; earn your bread there, do your prophesying there. We want no more prophesying in Bethel; this is the royal sanctuary, the national temple.’ ‘I was no prophet, neither did I belong to any of the brotherhoods of prophets.’ Amos replied to Amaziah, ‘I was a shepherd, and looked after sycamores: but it was the Lord who took me from herding the flock, and the Lord who said, “Go, prophesy to my people Israel.”’

Second Reading

Eph 1:3-14

Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of heaven in Christ. Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determined that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ for his own kind purposes, to make us praise the glory of his grace, his free gift to us in the Beloved in whom, through his blood, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins. Such is the richness of the grace which he has showered on us in all wisdom and insight. He has let us know the mystery of his purpose, the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end: that he would bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth. And it is in him that we were claimed as God’s own, chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory, the people who would put their hopes in Christ before he came. Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.

Gospel Reading

Mk 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff – no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals, but, he added, ‘Do not take a spare tunic.’ And he said to them, ‘If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.’ So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.
