

Dear parishioners and visitor's to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish,

How encouraging it has been to be able to gather together for the Mass these past few weeks. Welcome back, welcome Home! Let us continue to be vigilant and to pray for all those affected and struggling in these days.

This weekend we are reminded of a great truth, that Christianity is about meeting the God who is with us here and now, not once upon a time, far off and distant. Time and again through history God has reminded His people of how close He is. And so again in our day. He may feel distant, but if anything, Jesus teaches us that Catholicism is not about a feeling. It's about Facts! The Fact that God became incarnate by the Holy Spirit. The Fact that He was born of the Virgin Mary. The Fact that He preached and healed many. The Fact that Jesus in time and space instituted the priesthood and breathed life into His church on that first Pentecost; the Fact that He died on Calvary that we might be saved. And the Fact that God now remains with us in the Sacraments and in His Church, where He is present not in a feeling or empty symbol, but factually in the Eucharist, in unreserved fullness and glory.

While in some ways, Jesus' teaching style mirrored the rabbis of his day, in one way he was utterly distinct, this was in his use of parables. Jesus took the simplest, most mundane and familiar things, and used them to speak and reveal the most profound and fantastic truths.

In this week's Gospel we hear of a sower, going out to sow! Who is the sower? The sower is God. The God Who created everything that we know (and indeed all that we don't!) is painted as a sower! Most unnerving however is the fact that this sower doesn't seem too good at his trade! Seed wasn't that easy to come by and certainly not cheap. Jesus' listeners knew this! But we hear that the Sower is scattering seed all over the place! Casting seed everywhere almost recklessly! See what is happening here?

This parable speaks of the splendid extravagance of God! The seed, we are told, is the Word of God, the Word made flesh! God the Father sows the seed, Jesus, with an utter extravagance that makes no sense to the world.

God, so to speak, casts Jesus everywhere! The God who becomes incarnate is present in every place; every crevice, every road, and valley... There is no place that Jesus is not!

Jesus then speaks of the soil, in order to speak of the human heart and its receptiveness to the seed of the Word. There is the rich soil which reaps a rich harvest. But there is also the poor soil, which is hostile and rejecting of the seed of the Word; preventing it taking root and flourishing! 'Listen, anyone who has ears!' Jesus cries.

The Sower and the fertile soil - these familiar, humble things speak to us of the vast mysteries into which we have been immersed. In the end as God's sons and daughters, Jesus reminds us that we too are simple, humble, flesh and blood. And yet at the same time we are also His body, a community of faith, nourished by God and set in the world – to speak of the wonders of God's love; which are far beyond the world's wildest hopes or dreams.

In the Second reading Saint Paul encourages: "what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet unrevealed, which is waiting for us" (Romans 8:18). He continues "the entire creation, as we know, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth" (Rom 8:22). And so too the Church in our time, with all its pains and pangs. And yet, it endures in the certain knowledge of the promise which belongs to Her, when on that day, when every tear is wiped away, every broken heart restored, every burden of our ordinariness transformed, we, as the sons and daughters of God, finally behold the bride of Christ, the Church, in all her now transformed and unblemished beauty.

These are the facts – May our hearts be open and fertile soil for the Word that is given to us this day.

What is my Vocation? - GOD IS CALLING ... ARE YOU LISTENING?!

Do not be afraid to answer the call.

Don't expect a burning bush... It is not always easy to discern your vocation. There will be confirmations throughout life, however...there will also be distractions too. When Elijah listened for the Lord, he encountered a great wind, an earthquake and fire but the Lord was not in any of these signs. Rather God spoke in a "still, small voice" (1 Kings 19:11). We need the help of the Church to discern what God is asking of us, and a heart that opens itself courageously to the Holy Spirit. NEW PROTOCOLS - Please familiarize yourself with current guidelines

- •In accordance with government restrictions, **only 100 people** are permitted in the church at any one time. Entry to Mass will be through one door.
- •ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry. Records are renewed daily & destroyed after 28 days.
- •All attendees (including children) must complete the Mass Register prior to entry.
- •Communion is to be received in the hand only & not under the species of the Precious Blood
- •Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 4sqm p/p rule.
- •Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed. NB: Families can sit together.
- •Please use the hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your pew/space with the wipes provided at entrances.
- •There will be no physical contact at the sign of peace.
- •No collection plates to be passed around, but money/envelopes placed at collection points.

Collection Points—New ways of Giving and Receiving

The Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn has now begun to move towards a simpler, and safer way of collecting money for parishioners and parish staff. Collection plates will <u>no longer</u> be passed about during Masses. Instead, we are introducing **donation points** around the Cathedral and Saint Peter Chanel's for your convenience. You are still able to donate in cash, however we strongly encourage electronic means of making your offering. **Direct debit** and **QKR** options are now available, as well as **TapnGo** machines (more of which will be located around our churches soon. Apologies for this delay).

Readings of the Day – 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower; all who come to him will live

for ever. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: The sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for her young: by your altars, O Lord of

hosts, my King and my God. Blessed are they who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise.

First Reading Is 55:10-11

Thus says the Lord: 'As the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.'

Second Reading Rom 8:18-23

I think that what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet unrevealed, which is waiting for us. The whole creation is eagerly waiting for God to reveal his sons. It was not for any fault on the part of creation that it was made unable to attain its purpose, it was made so by God; but creation still retains the hope of being freed, like us, from its slavery to decadence, to enjoy the same freedom and glory as the children of God. From the beginning till now the entire creation, as we know, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth; and not only creation, but all of us who possess the first-fruits of the Spirit, we too groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free.

Gospel Reading Mt 13:1-23

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables. He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!' Then the disciples went up to him and asked, Why do you talk to them in parables?' 'Because' he replied 'the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you, but they are not revealed to them. For anyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. The reason I talk to them in parables is that they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. So in their case this prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled: You will listen and listen again, but not understand, see and see again, but not perceive. For the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and be converted and be healed by me. 'But happy are your eyes because they see, your ears because they hear! I tell you solemnly, many prophets and holy men longed to see what you see, and never saw it; to hear what you hear, and never heard it. 'You, therefore, are to hear the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom without understanding, the evil one comes and carries off what was sown in his heart: this is the man who received the seed on the edge of the path. The one who received it on patches of rock is the man who hears the word and welcomes it at once with joy. But he has no root in him, he does not last; let some trial come, or some persecution on account of the word, and he falls away at once. The one who received the seed in thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this world and the lure of riches choke the word and so he produces nothing. And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the man who hears the word and understands it; he is the one who yields a harvest and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty.'
