Dear parishioners and visitors,

Imagine the excitement of the twelve, returning to Jesus, after being sent out to preach repentance, to heal the sick, and to drive out evil, as we hear in today's Gospel. But now, they discover a problem: the crowds won't leave them alone! It seems that just as the Twelve shared in Jesus' ministry, they now equally share his popularity. Such was the situation, we hear that the poor disciples have no time, even to eat!

Now comes the revelation from Jesus himself, of the foundational character of the disciple, of the one who bears the name of Christian - not just in name but in their very being. Marvelling at what they had experienced, how they had changed people and indeed, how they themselves had changed, Jesus now extends to them an instruction, or rather, an invitation. "Ok, now come away a while... come away and rest."

And so we hear they board a boat. "Great!", the disciples must be thinking. "We'll go for a day or so... recoup, undistracted, relaxed, alone." Yet as soon as they arrive, the crowds are already there! The crowds are so persistent that the disciples, now exhausted, and even now with Jesus' by their side, feel they cannot find one moment of solace. The disciples must have thought "are you kidding!" "Good one Jesus... you said to come away for a while and rest!" "Alone? We're not alone at all!"

Did Jesus just 'get it wrong'. "Sorry guys, I didn't realise that everyone knew this place!" Did Jesus just not realise? ... not quite.

The reality is, they had come away, and in just the way Jesus had intended. They had returned to the presence of the Lord and in so doing had been renewed, reformed and reminded. Renewed in their confidence, amid the darkened world they face. Re-formed in the image, of the One in whom they were Created. And reminded of the dignity they bear, as those who profess the faith, and followers in their Master's footsteps.

This presence was not one which promised that every worry would be cast away. Nor that every thought had to be absent from their mind, for God to be worshiped. Or equally, that every distraction needed to sink into the abvss for them to be at 'rest'.

Jesus wanted his disciples to come away and rest, yet the rest he spoke of, the "coming away" which he invited the disciples too, was of a nature so much more nourishing and necessary than some lonely patch of turf could provide. What Christ was truly saying was: "Come away a while, and rest in Me!"

In days and times like these, such a reminder is more necessary than ever. We cannot escape the worries and burdens which besiege us on every side.

When we come to Mass, when we come to the Sacraments - rest doesn't necessarily manifest itself. Just as for the disciples, we're often still distracted, not always relaxed and certainly not alone.

Just like the disciples, the demands that are made on us daily, remain. The worries that pester our minds, endure. Yet what does change in this moment, is the fact that we dwell in the presence of a God who dwells in that distraction, anxiety, and in the midst of the mess.

In prayer, and in the high point of the Mass, we come away (even if so very briefly) and rest in God, our Creator; and in so doing we are nourished and reminded of who we are and the dignity we bear. Yet note too, Jesus doesn't say "Come away... and stay away!" But come away, 'for a while!' Which implies a return to the work from which we seek rest. So the life of the Christian. We labour in the world as witnesses to the God of Truth, Beauty and Goodness. This is what we receive in the Sacraments - this is what we do every Sunday when in the Mass we 'come away' - not with the intention of staying, but returning to the world, where the crowds and the distractions pick up again, right off from where we left them. Only to faithfully 'come away' again, to rest in

Saint Joseph was certainly one who knew the necessity of resting in God. Indeed, God spoke to Joseph when he was the most silent and receptive - when he was asleep! Asleep, he hears the call to have no fear, and take Mary as his wife. In his slumber he heard the call to flee to Egypt, to save the child. Pope Francis has a powerful devotion to 'Sleeping St. Joseph'. He writes: "Joseph's rest revealed God's will to him. In this moment of rest in the Lord, as we pause from our many daily obligations and activities, God is also speaking to us... But like Saint Joseph, once we have heard God's voice, we must rise from our slumber; we must get up and act".

Our parish has introduced its own Sleeping St Joseph statue in the Sacred Heart Chapel, which the Archbishop will bless at the end of the 11am Mass next week (25th July). This day will also fittingly mark the inaugural World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly. The Archbishop, on this wonderful occasion, will extend a special blessing upon all grandparents and older parishioners, giving thanks for the wisdom and faith they offer and the treasure they gift the Church, their grandchildren and the world.

Readings of the Day – 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B



Entrance Antiphon: See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me Alleluia! **Communion Antiphon:** The Lord, the gracious, the merciful, has made a memorial of his wonders; he gives food to those who fear him.

First Reading Jer 23:1-6

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks! 'See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The Lord-our-integrity.'

Second Reading Eph 2:13-18

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.

Gospel Reading Mk 6:30-34

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, 'You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while'; for there were so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But people saw them going, and many could guess where; and from every town they all hurried to the place on foot and reached it before them. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at some length.
