Eternity shows us true value

The responsorial psalm puts it best: "Make us know the shortness of our life, that we may gain wisdom of heart." When we truly know how short our life is then we begin to understand what is actually important.

This is the heart of today's gospel. The foolish man is not called foolish because he is storing away his grain, to tell the truth, such a thing reveals his prudence and wisdom. Rather the foolish man is called foolish because he is wasting his life. He is chasing after the false gods we call security and comfort. The rich man is a fool, because in following a life dedicated to security and comfort, he has missed the point and purpose of his life. The rich man comes before God with no treasure to offer, he has valued the wrong things, as his heart and soul are dedicated to bigger barns and good food and wine.

The message of the Gospel is not: that we should not be rich; but rather, that we should not be poor of heart. What is more important when we face an eternity with God, our present suffering, or our value in His eyes? True richness does not consist of gold or silver, nor in power, abundance or scarcity, nor even in health – all these things are temporary. We ought to strive only for what is eternal. There might be some good in temporary things, but it is only that which eternally endures that truly has value.

What is the only thing that lasts forever? We know the answer is love, but, what sort of love lasts forever? Is it our love which lasts forever? The rich man's love for his food and barns has done him no good. Our love for each other will only last as long as we last, and everything material will decay and fade away and be forgotten.

There are two things we know which are not material, our soul and God. The love that God has for us and our love of him will never die. The great task of our short lives here on earth is to find treasure for our souls in heaven, this treasure is whatever helps us to deepen our love for him and helps us to understand his love for us.

First Reading Eccl 1:2; 2:21-23

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity! For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skillfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

Second Reading Col 3:1-5, 9-11

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him. That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

Gospel Lk 12:13-21

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.' Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having had a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do; I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'
