Love the Giver, more than the Gift

In the Gospel this Sunday we hear Our Lord admonish the crowd. He says that they are not following Him for the correct reason. They are following Him because of the miracle he worked in last Sunday's Gospel, the feeding of the five thousand. He says the real reason they are following him isn't because they believe in him, but rather because they had all the food they could eat.

Why would this upset Jesus? Surely, He's the one who fed them... what did He expect to happen? Why wouldn't we expect hungry people to follow someone who can give them miraculous amounts of food?

Our Lord is unhappy, not because people are rejecting him, but because they misunderstand him. Jesus isn't trying to win votes, He doesn't need a following, what He wants is genuine relationship and understanding. Jesus wants people to follow Him because they understand the mercy and compassion of God, He wants people who will appreciate His sacrifice. Jesus doesn't want to be a magician or a charitable organization, He wants God and Humanity to be reconciled.

Here is a great danger for Christians: are we following God because we believe? Or are we following because we believe it is good for us? If we treat God in this sort of transactional way, our religion and our world quickly become very selfish. If the real question on our heart is 'What is best for me?' and not 'Who is God?' or, 'How can I live out His teaching?' our relationship with God becomes one-sided. We start to love the gift instead of the giver.

Once we have accepted that God is real, we grow in relationship with Him. How do we do this? How can we deepen, or fix our relationship with God? We need to look beyond the gifts, and miracles and wonders, and look instead to the person and the heart of God. "Why does God give us this, or that?" "Why does God allow this or that?" These are the questions we should start asking.

It is enlightening to see Jesus' motive for His miracles, usually Our Lord works a miracle out of compassion – and only sometimes out of necessity. It's also useful to see what Jesus doesn't do – he doesn't pay the people's tax for them, He never turns the Romans to ash, or causes Herod to break out in pimples, nor does He free St. John the Baptist from prison. What is Jesus trying to show us by this? Every miracle is an act from the very heart of God.

Jesus wants the hungry crowd to see not His power, but His purpose. Rather than bread and plenty, He wants us to see His wealth of compassion. Jesus wants us to look beyond the things of this world, and instead gaze into heaven.

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B — 3/4 August



Entrance Antiphon: O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me! You are my rescuer, my help; O Lord, do not delay.

Responsorial: The Lord gave them bread from heaven.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.

Communion Antiphon: You have given us, O Lord, bread from heaven, endowed with all delights and sweetness in every taste.

First Reading Ex 16:2-4. 12-15

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our hearts content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!' Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.' 'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your hearts content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God."' And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

Second Reading Eph 4:17,20-24

I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live. Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life; you must put aside your old self, which gets corrupted by following illusory desires. Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth.

Gospel John 6:24-35

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered: 'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat. Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life, the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you, for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.' Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.' Jesus answered: 'I tell you most solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.' 'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered: 'I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'
