First Sunday in Lent

What a disturbing 2 years we've witnessed, and now the heartache unravelling in Ukraine. In a world stooped in extraordinary uncertainty- instability, war and constant change - we can find ourselves anxious on many fronts. Uncertainty is often what brings so many unstuck. Yet, as Christians, we are called to focus not upon the *uncertainty*, but rather the Certainty we do have. Take to heart the powerful words of Pope Francis:

"Once again Lent comes to make its prophetic appeal, to remind us that it is possible to create something <u>new</u> within ourselves and around us, <u>simply because God is faithful</u>, always faithful, for he cannot deny himself, he continues to be rich in goodness and mercy, and he is always ready to forgive and start afresh. With this filial confidence, let us set out on the journey!"

- Pope Francis, Homily for Ash Wednesday, 2014.

How significant Pope Francis' words are, in the mire we and our world find ourselves. He speaks of the *Hope* and *Newness*, offered in Jesus.

As we settle into this gifted season, may the ears of our hearts be sharpened to the daily call of our God, that these words characterise the 40 days ahead:

"God is always faithful"... and so, "in filial confidence, let us set out on the journey!"

The darkness of a world that pushes Jesus aside, hoping vainly to 'mend' and medicate its own wounds and ego, is always doomed to suffer, flounder and die. Jesus delivers the lasting promise of peace—one both external and internal—impossible to achieve alone. When others attempt to inflict their own wills and empires, the Christian instinct speaks truth, and reminds us, that all is in vain unless Christ and his message of truth, life and love are at the centre!

And so, despite the darkness that encroaches upon our world, swelling it up in an abyss of uncertainty and sadness, we are reminded – God remains with us, closer than ever. God is not ignorant of human suffering, but present within it, in order to transform it from within—this is the truth of the Lenten journey! God is in our midst, because Christ is in our midst. Let us *LIVE* this truth, these forty days, and be changed by them.

For everything our human hearts long for, Christ *can* give! But dare we deny ourselves, our *own* aspirations, and avail ourselves to receive this transforming mercy given?

In the next 40 days, pray with the daily readings – listen to what Jesus is saying to you, seeking Him out in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Confession. For he speaks not in puzzles or hidden gnostic tones, but directly to you and I, each day.

It is fitting that this Sunday we welcome those seeking baptism and full communion with the Church at Easter. Those who have been baptised Christian and who desire to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church will be formally welcomed by the Archbishop.

The *Rite of Election* will take place at **10am on Sunday**, and marks the beginning of a period where the 'elect' (as they will soon be called) come to know Jesus more deeply, surrounded by their new family in faith. Our friends will be baptised and received into full communion at the Easter Vigil. We congratulate our brothers and sisters and pledge our prayers as we continue the great journey *together*.

May Jesus be always, their guide, certainty, and *Life* itself. Let's continue to pray for our world, and all her people.

- Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.
- The law of fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year.
- In Lent, we omit the "Alleluia" at Mass.

Responsorial Psalm: Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble

Gospel Acclamation: No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God

Communion Antiphon: One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.

First Reading Dt 26:4-10

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement: "My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God.'

Second Reading Rom 10:8-13

Scripture says: The word, that is the faith we proclaim, is very near to you, it is on your lips and in your heart. If your lips confess that Jesus is Lord and if you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips you are saved. When scripture says: those who believe in him will have no cause for shame, it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask for his help, for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Gospel Lk 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.' Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.
